ACTIVITIES OF THE 184TH INFANTRY REGIMENT

The 184th Infantry Regiment was organized July 3, 1921. At that time there were only two battalions in the organization. In January, 1926, the Military Bureau of the War Department authorized the organization of the Third Battalion. A few months later the Quartermaster Company and Medical Detachment were authorized, thus completing the full quota of a regiment.

A brief account of the changes and redesignations of the units of the 184th Infantry will be given in alphabetical order.

The Headquarters Company history dates from July 29, 1870, when it was organized in Sacramento as the Searfield Guard. The name was in honor of the volunteer militia warrior, Patrick Searfield. In 1880, the name Searfield Guard was changed to Headquarters Company. In 1885, in accordance with new military regulations, and on July 1, 1893, Company B, First Artillery Regiment, Fourth Brigade. Thirteen years later, on July 1, 1906, Company B, First Artillery Regiment was redesignated Company C, Second Infantry Regiment, California National Guard. The unit was with the Second Infantry Regiment during the disturbances on the Mexican border, June 17, 1916 to November 25, 1916. Company C was next called into Federal Service on March 26, 1917. On October 13, 1917, Company C, Second Infantry Regiment was redesignated Company G, 160th Infantry Regiment. At the conclusion of the World War Company G returned to the United States and was mustered out April 14, 1919. On July 22, 1919, the Fifth Separate Company, Infantry was organized in Sacramento, and on October 1, 1921 was designated Company G, 179th Infantry Regiment. When the 184th Infantry Regiment was organized July 1, 1924, Company G, 179th Infantry Regiment became Company G, 184th Infantry Regiment. One year later, September 30, 1925, Company G was redesignated Headquarters Company, 184th Infantry Regiment. Eleven years later, November 16, 1936,

The only change in the Service Company took place on November 1, 1928, when the unit was designated Company G, 184th Infantry Regiment, and Company G, 184th Infantry Regiment became Service Company, 184th Infantry Regiment.

The history of the Machine Gun Company, 184th Infantry Regiment began January 26, 1916, when the unit was organized as Machine Gun Company, Second Infantry Regiment. The Machine Gun Company as part of the Second Infantry Regiment went to the Mexican border June 17, 1916. On November 25, 1916, the unit was mustered out of the Federal Service, but it proved to be for a few months only. On March 26, 1917, the Machine Gun Company re-entered the Federal Service for duty during the World War. On November 1, 1917, Machine Gun Company

ACTIVITIES OF THE 184TH INFANTRY REGIMENT

The 184th Infantry Regiment was organized July 1, 1924. At that time there were only two battalions in the organization. In January, 1926, the Militia Bureau of the War Department authorized the organization of the Third Battalion. A few months later the Howitzer Company and Medical Detachment were authorized, thus completing the full quota of a regiment.

A brief account of the changes and redesignations of the units of the 184th Infantry will be given in alphabetical order.

The Headquarter's Company history dates from July 29, 1870, when it was organized in Sacramento as the Sarsfield Grenadier Guard. The name was in honor of the celebrated Irish warrior, Patrick Sarsfield. In 1880, the name Sarsfield Grenadier Guard was dropped in accordance with new military regulations, and on March 19th of that year the Company was redesignated Company G, First Artillery Regiment, Fourth Brigade. Thirteen years later, on July 1, 1893, Company G, First Artillery Regiment was redesignated Company G, Second Infantry Regiment, California National Guard. The unit was with the Second Infantry Regiment during the disturbance on the Mexican Border, June 17, 1916 to November 15, 1916. Company G was next called into Federal Service on March 26, 1917. On October 13, 1917, Company G, Second Infantry Regiment was redesignated Company G, 160th Infantry Regiment. At the conclusion of the World War Company G returned to the United States and was mustered out April 14, 1919. On July 22, 1919, the Fifth Separate Company, Infantry was organized in Sacramento, and on October 1, 1921 was designated Company G, 159th Infantry Regiment. When the 184th Infantry Regiment was organized, July 1, 1924, Company G, 159th Infantry Regiment became Company G, 184th Infantry Regiment. One year later, September 30, 1925, Company G was redesignated Headquarters Company, 184th Infantry Regiment. Eleven years later, November 16, 1936, Headquarters Company was redesignated Company B, 184th Infantry Regiment and Company B was designated Headquarters Company of that regiment.

The Service Company makes no claim to military service prior to March 20, 1925, the date of its organization. The only change in the Service Company took place on November 1, 1936, when the unit was designated Company C, 184th Infantry Regiment and Company C, 184th Infantry Regiment became Service Company, 184th Infantry Regiment.

The history of the Howitzer Company, 184th Infantry Regiment began January 25, 1916, when the unit was organized as Machine Gun Company, Second Infantry Regiment. The Machine Gun Company as part of the Second Infantry Regiment went to the Mexican Border June 27, 1916. On November 15, 1916, the unit was mustered out of the Federal Service, but it proved to be for a few months only. On March 26, 1917, the Machine Gun Company re-entered the Federal Service for duty during the World War. On November 1, 1917, Machine Gun Company

Second Infantry Regiment was redesignated Machine Gun Company, 159th Infantry Regiment. On April 15, 1919, the Company was mustered out of Federal Service. The history of Machine Gun Company, Second Infantry Regiment was resumed May 6, 1926, when the Howitzer Company, 184th Infantry Regiment was organized in Sacramento. One more change took place in the Howitzer Company, when on November 5, 1935, the Company was redesignated Company D, 184th Infantry Regiment, and Company D was designated Howitzer Company, 184th Infantry Regiment. The reason for the change was the desire of the Militia Bureau to have the entire First Battalion, 184th Infantry Regiment located in Sacramento.

The history of the Headquarters Company, First Battalion dates from January 26, 1888, when Company F, Sixth Infantry Regiment was organized. There was no change in the designation of Company F until May 11, 1907, when it became Company K, Second Infantry Regiment. The unit was on the Mexican Border in 1916, and with the Second Infantry Regiment was mustered into Service for duty during the World on March 26, 1917. On October 13, 1917, Companies K, and C, Second Infantry Regiment were consolidated and designated Company L, 159th Infantry Regiment. Company L was demobilized May 2, 1919. When the 184th Infantry Regiment was organized on July 1, 1924, Headquarters Company, Second Battalion, 159th Infantry Regiment, located in Fresno, was designated Headquarters Company, 184th Infantry Regiment. The organization of the 185th Infantry Regiment in 1929 resulted in Headquarters Company, First Battalion, 184th Infantry Regiment being converted into Service Company, 185th Infantry Regiment on April 1, 1929. A new company was then organized in Woodland and designated Headquarters Company, First Battalion, 184th Infantry Regiment, March 29, 1930. No further changes were made in the unit.

The claim of Company A for prior military service dates back to May 24, 1893. On that date Company H, Fifth Infantry Regiment, Third Brigade was organized. On December 9, 1895, Company H, Fifth Infantry Regiment, Third Brigade was redesignated Company H, Sixth Infantry Regiment. Company H was mustered into Federal Service for duty during the Spanish-American War, May 11, 1898, and helped to man the forts and perform garrison duty on the Pacific Coast while the Regulars were ordered to foreign service. On December 15, 1898, Company H was mustered out of Federal Service, and about eight years later, on May 10, 1907 was mustered out of the service of the State. A new Company A was organized in Modesto, February 6, 1924, and about two years later, on March 1, 1926 was redesignated Company K, 184th Infantry Regiment. Company L, 184th Infantry Regiment next became Company A, when Company A was disbanded November 1, 1927. The new Company L then became Company A, 184th Infantry Regiment on December 8, 1927. This unit was transferred as Company A to the 185th Infantry Regiment, April 1, 1929, and Company I, 184th Infantry Regiment was designated Company A, 184th Infantry Regiment, March 6, 1930. There were no other changes in Company A at the time of this writing December, 1937.

Company B dates from March 14, 1900, when Company I, Sixth Infantry Regiment was organized. On May 11, 1907, Company I, Sixth Infantry Regiment was redesignated Company M, Second Infantry Regiment. Company M saw service on the Mexican Border from June 27, 1916 to November 15, 1916. On April 8, 1917 the Company was mustered into Federal Service, and on October 13, 1917, was designated Company E, 160th Infantry Regiment. On May 7, 1919, Company E was demobilized. On March 12, 1924 a new Company B was organized in Hanford. Company B's next change was to Company B, 185th Infantry Regiment on April 1, 1929. Company E, 184th Infantry Regiment became Company B, 184th on March 6, 1930. Company B's next and also last change was on November 16, 1936, when it was redesignated Headquarters Company, 184th Infantry Regiment, and Headquarters Company was redesignated Company B, 184th Infantry Regiment.

Company C also boasted of early day military history. Organized as Company C, Sixth Infantry Regiment, Third Brigade on June 15, 1885, this unit rendered valuable service to the Federal Government during the Spanish-American War, when the Sixth Infantry Regiment was mustered into Federal Service on May 11, 1898. When the Sixth Infantry Regiment was disbanded on May 10, 1907, Company C was transferred to the Second Infantry Regiment and designated Company C. As Company C, Second Infantry Regiment this unit saw service on the Mexican Border from June 27, to November 15, 1916. The following year, on April 9, 1917, Company C was mustered into the Federal Service for duty during the World War. On October 13, 1917, Companies C and K, Second Infantry were consolidated and designated Company L, 159th Infantry Regiment. Company L was demobilized May 2, 1919. On October 4, 1920 a new company was organized in Fresno and designated Second Separate Company. One year later, on October 1, 1921, the Second Separate Company was designated Company E in the newly organized 159th Infantry Regiment. Company E was detached from the 159th Infantry Regiment July 1, 1924 and became Company C, 184th Infantry Regiment. When the 185th Infantry Regiment was organized April 1, 1929, Company C, 184th Infantry was redesignated Headquarters Company, 185th Infantry Regiment. A new Company C was organized in Auburn April 10, 1929. On March 1, 1932, Company C at Auburn was redesignated Company E, 184th Infantry Regiment and Company C, 185th Infantry Regiment, Modesto was designated Company C, 184th. On November 16, 1936, Company C was redesignated Service Company and Service Company at Sacramento became Company C, 184th Infantry Regiment.

The early history of Company D, 184th Infantry Regiment parallels that of Company C. Company D's history goes back to December 9, 1887, when Company E of the Sixth Infantry Battalion was organized. Company E as part of the Sixth Infantry Regiment served their country during the Spanish-American War. In 1907 the Regiment was discontinued, and on May 11 of that year Company E was assigned to the Second Infantry Regiment as Company D. Two years later, May 5, 1909, the Company was mustered out of the Service of the State. A new Company D, Second Infantry Regiment was organized in Visalia on June 19, 1909.

This new unit was mustered out October 25, 1915. A new company known as First Separate Company, located in Visalia, where it was organized April 13, 1915 was redesignated Company D, Second Infantry Regiment, October 25, 1915. Company D, as part of the Second Infantry Regiment served the United States Government during the Spanish-American War, and entered the World War on April 9, 1917, was redesignated Company M, 159th Infantry Regiment October 13, 1917, and was demobilized May 2, 1919. When the 184th Infantry Regiment was organized July 1, 1924, Company H, 159th Infantry Regiment, located in Fresno, was designated Company D, 184th Infantry Regiment. Once again Company D was disbanded February 5, 1925. Company M of the 184th, located at Visalia, became Company D on April 26, 1926. The organization of the 185th Infantry Regiment on April 1, 1929 resulted in Company D of the 184th Infantry Regiment. Company G, 159th Infantry, located in Gilroy, was next designated Company D, 184th, and on November 5, 1935, Company D was redesignated Howitzer Company, 184th Infantry Regiment, and the Howitzer Company, located in Sacramento, was designated Company D of the 184th.

Headquarters Company, Second Battalion made no claim to past military history. Organized in Maxwell, Colusa County, June 3, 1924, the unit underwent only one change from 1924 to date. That change came in 1937, when the location of the Company was moved from Maxwell to Williams, only a few miles away.

Company E, Second Battalion, 184th Infantry boasts of one of the earliest histories of the Regiment. Organized as the Union Cavalry, Buckeye, Yolo County, June 25, 1863, the unit remained in the service of the State about three years and was, on July 27, 1866, disbanded. A new Yolo Union Cavalry unit took the place of the old Company on November 17, 1866, but after a year of service was mustered out on December 19, 1867. On March 5, 1881 a new company, organized in Woodland, Yolo County, was designated Company F, First Artillery Regiment. On July 1, 1893, the new Company F was designated Company F, Second Infantry Regiment. On July 30, 1898, Company F was disbanded and a new company was organized in Woodland. Company F went to the Mexican Border on June 27, 1916, in Federal Service, and returned on November 15, 1916. On April 9, 1917, the unit again entered the Federal Service for duty during the World War. Company F, Second Infantry Regiment was redesignated Company F, 160th Infantry Regiment, October 14, 1917, and was demobilized May 2, 1919. On June 2, 1924, Company E, 184th Infantry Regiment was organized in Stockton. On March 1, 1926, Company E was redesignated Company I of the 184th. A new company was organized in Woodland April 21, 1926, and designated Company E, 184th Infantry Regiment. Company E was changed to Company B, 184th March 6, 1930. A new company was then organized at Red Bluff on March 7, 1930. This unit was disbanded September 25, 1931, and Company C, 184th Infantry Regiment, located in Auburn, was redesignated Company E, 184th Infantry on March 1, 1932. This was the last change made in the location of Company E.

Company F was organized in 1887 under the name of the Colusa Guard, Unattached. On February 15, 1890 the Colusa Guard was redesignated Company B, Eighth Infantry Battalion, Fifth Brigade. The following year, October 31, 1891, Company B was redesignated Company B, Eighth Infantry Regiment, Fifth Brigade. On December 9, 1895, Company B was redesignated Company B, Second Infantry Regiment, Third Brigade. Company B served during the Spanish-American War as Company K, Eighth Infantry Regiment from July 6, 1898 to December 15, 1898. After having been mustered out of the Federal Service the unit re-entered the National Guard, June 14, 1899, under the old designation of Company B, Second Infantry Regiment. Eleven years later, on September 24, 1910, Company B was disbanded. On June 24, 1916, a new company was organized in Willows and designated Company B, Second Infantry Regiment. Three days after the organization of the new Company B the unit was ordered to the Mexican Border for patrol duty in Federal Service. After about five months service, on November 15, 1916, Company B, as part of the Second Infantry Regiment, returned from the Border and was mustered out of Federal Service. A few months later, on April 13, 1917, Company B, as part of the Second Infantry was again called into Federal Service for duty during the World War. On October 13, 1917, Company B was redesignated Company B, 159th Infantry Regiment, and the Second Infantry Regiment, National Guard of California ceased to exist. After the close of the World War Company B was demobilized on May 2, 1919, and on July 22, 1921 a new Company known as Sixth Separate Company was organized in Colusa and was designated as Company F, 159th Infantry on October 1, 1921. When the 184th Infantry Regiment was organized on July 1, 1924, Company F, 159th Infantry Regiment became Company F, 184th Infantry Regiment. The unit was disbanded September 30, 1925. A new Company F was organized in Marysville on November 3, 1925, and has maintained its location up to the present date.

Company G was formerly the Chico Light Infantry, organized in Chico December 10, 1862. The Company was mustered out July 28, 1866. A new company was organized in Chico May 18, 1875 and was designated as Chico Guard, Unattached. On February 15, 1890 the name Chico Guard, Unattached, was dropped and the unit was designated Company A, Eighth Infantry Battalion, Fifth Brigade. About a year later the Eighth Infantry Battalion was reorganized as a regiment and on October 31, 1891, Company A, Eighth Infantry Battalion became Company A, Eighth Infantry Regiment. When the National Guard was reorganized, December 7 and 9, 1895, Companies A and F, Eighth Infantry Regiment were consolidated and designated Company A, Second Infantry Regiment.

During the Spanish-American War Company A was redesignated Company A, Eighth Infantry Regiment and as such served in the United States Army Volunteers from July 7, 1898 to February 6, 1899. Upon re-entering the National Guard May 4, 1899, Company A was again made Company A, Second Infantry Regiment. For a second time Company A, Second Infantry Regiment entered the Federal Service, June 27, to November 15, 1916, when they served on the

Mexican Border. Out of Federal Service November 15, 1916, and back in again on April 9, 1917, to serve during the World War was the next move of Company A, Second Infantry Regiment. On November 1, 1917, the Company was redesignated Company I, 159th Infantry Regiment, and as such served during the World War. On May 1, 1919, Company I, 159th Infantry Regiment was demobilized.

When the 184th Infantry Regiment was organized July 1, 1924, Company G, 159th Infantry Regiment, located in Sacramento, was transferred to the 184th Infantry Regiment as Company G. On September 30, 1925, Company G was converted into Regimental Headquarters Company, 184th Infantry Regiment. A new company was organized in Chico on April 6, 1926, and designated Company G, and for eleven years no change in designation or location has occurred.

Company H was organized as Company C, Eighth Infantry Battalion in Marysville December 19, 1889. One year later the Eighth Battalion was increased to a regiment. On December 9, 1895, Company C was redesignated Company D, Second Infantry Regiment. Nearly three years later, on July 7, 1898, Company D was mustered into Federal Service for duty during the Spanish-American War as Company L, Eighth Infantry Regiment. On February 6, 1899 the Company was mustered out of Federal Service and re-entered the California National Guard as Company D, Second Infantry Regiment on May 16, 1899. On May 10, 1907, Company D was mustered out of the National Guard. Nine years later, on February 3, 1916, a new company was organized in Red Bluff and designated Company H, Second Infantry Regiment. This unit served the Federal Government on the Mexican Border from June 27, 1916 to November 15, 1916. On April 9, 1917, the company was mustered into Federal Service for duty during the World War. On October 13, 1917, Company H, Second Infantry Regiment was redesignated Company H, 160th Infantry Regiment. Company H was demobilized April 15, 1919. The present Company H, 184th Infantry Regiment was organized in Yuba City March 11, 1924 and has retained its location and designation for fourteen years without change.

Headquarters Company, Third Battalion was first organized on February 10, 1926 in Oakdale. When the 185th Infantry Regiment was organized on April 1, 1929, the Oakdale company was transferred to that regiment as Headquarters Company, First Battalion. A new company was organized in Sacramento and designated Headquarters Company, Third Battalion, 184th Infantry on April 2, 1929. On April 13, 1936, this unit was redesignated Headquarters Company, 79th Brigade. A new Headquarters Company for the Third Battalion of the 184th was then organized in St. Helena on April 13, 1936.

The history of Company I dates back to September 7, 1861, when the Stockton Union Guard was organized in Stockton. On February 2, 1888 the Stockton Union Guard was designated Company A, Sixth Infantry Regiment. Company A, as part of the Sixth Infantry Regiment was mustered into Federal Service during the Spanish-American War on May 11, 1898, and was mustered out December 15, 1898. On May 10, 1907, the Company was disbanded. A new Company A was

organized in Stockton as Eighth Separate Company on February 9, 1918, but so many of its members were transferred into the Federal Service during the World War that it proved impossible to maintain the unit at war strength, so on April 28, 1918, the Company was disbanded. Early in 1926 provision was made for bringing the 184th Infantry Regiment up to a full strength regiment. That effort resulted in Company E, 184th Infantry Regiment, located in Stockton, being redesignated Company I, 184th Infantry Regiment on March 1, 1926. Approximately two years later, on October 16, 1928, Company I was disbanded. A new Company I was organized in Sacramento on November 14, 1928, and on March 6, 1930 became Company A, 184th Infantry Regiment. A new company was organized in Eureka and designated Company I, and still maintains that location and designation.

Company K can also boast of a former military record of service. Organized in Modesto October 29, 1887, the unit was designated Company D, Sixth Infantry Regiment. Company D served with the Sixth Infantry during the Spanish-American War from May 11, to December 15, 1898. When the National Guard was reorganized in May 1907, Company D was one of the many units disbanded. On March 9, 1918, the Twelfth Separate Company was organized in Modesto, but was mustered out on March 12, 1919. On February 6, 1924, Company A, 184th Infantry was organized in Modesto. This unit was redesignated Company K, 184th Infantry Regiment on March 1, 1926. Company K was redesignated Company C, 185th Infantry Regiment April 1, 1929. A new company was then organized in Santa Rosa and designated Company K, 184th Infantry Regiment on May 6, 1929. No other changes have occurred to date.

Company L was organized in Merced September 10, 1924. On March 1, 1926, Company L was redesignated Company A, 184th Infantry Regiment. A new company L was organized in Turlock March 1st, 1926. Once again Company L was redesignated Company A, 184th Infantry Regiment on December 8, 1927. A new Company L was next organized in Napa on December 9, 1927. No changes have occurred since that date.

Company M was organized in Visalia May 16, 1924. On July 1, 1924 the company was redesignated Company H, 159th Infantry Regiment, and on October 1, 1924, Company H of the 159th Infantry Regiment was redesignated Company M of the 184th Infantry. On April 26, 1926, Company M was redesignated Company D, 184th Infantry Regiment. A new company was organized in Petaluma and designated Company M, 184th Infantry Regiment on May 10, 1926. No change has taken place since that date.

The history of the Medical Detachment dates back to April 19, 1901, when the Sanitary Corps, Second Infantry Regiment was organized. The detachment served with the Second Infantry Regiment during the Mexican Border trouble in 1916, and was mustered into the Federal Service again on April 5, 1917. On November 1, 1917, the Sanitary Detachment was redesignated Medical Detachment, 160th Infantry Regiment. On May 7, 1919, the unit was demobilized.

A new company was organized in Fresno on May 20, 1926, and designated Medical Detachment, 184th Infantry Regiment. On April 1, 1929, the Detachment was redesignated Medical Detachment, 185th Infantry Regiment. A new detachment was then organized in Sacramento and designated Medical Detachment, 184th Infantry Regiment.

Next, a brief history of the commanding officers of the regiment and battalions will be given. The first commanding officer of the newly organized 184th Infantry Regiment was Lieutenant-Colonel Ray W. Hays. Colonel Hays joined the National Guard as a private in Company C, Second Infantry Regiment. On July 16, 1917, he was transferred to Machine Gun Troop No. 1, United States Cavalry. On November 26, 1917, he was commissioned First Lieutenant and assigned to Machine Gun Company, 362nd Infantry Regiment. He served in France from December, 1917, to June, 1919. On February 19, 1918, Colonel Hays was promoted to Captain and assigned to Company B, 12th Machine Gun Company, 40th Division. His company participated in the St. Mihiel, Meuse-Argonne, and Ypres-Lys offensives. When the National Guard was reorganized after the World War, Lieutenant-Colonel Hays was commissioned Captain, California National Guard and assigned to Company H, 159th Infantry Regiment on July 17, 1922. On September 29, 1922, he was commissioned Major, 159th Infantry Regiment. The Major was commissioned Lieutenant-Colonel on October 11, 1924 and placed in command of the First and Second Battalions, 184th Infantry Regiment. He remained as executive officer of the 184th Infantry until April 1, 1929, when he was transferred to the newly organized 184th Infantry Regiment.

The first Colonel of the 184th Infantry Regiment was Colonel Wallace A. Mason, a World War veteran. The Colonel enlisted as a private in Company A, Engineers, California National Guard on July 21, 1916. He served on the Mexican Border with Company A. When the National Guard was called into Federal service on August 5, 1917, Colonel Mason's commissions were as follows: Second Lieutenant, November 18, 1916; First Lieutenant, July 31, 1917. He was promoted to Captain August 29, 1917, and to Major, March 19, 1919. When the Engineers were mustered out Colonel Mason was transferred to the Officers Reserve Corps. From the Officers Reserve Corps he was commissioned Colonel, California National Guard and assigned to the command of the 184th Infantry Regiment. On March 18, 1930, Colonel Mason was promoted to Brigadier-General.

Lieutenant-Colonel Charles R. Blood was promoted to Colonel on May 3, 1930. Colonel Blood joined the Officers Training Corps May 13, 1917. Was commissioned First Lieutenant August 15, 1917 and served in the 159th Infantry Regiment, 40th Division. He was transferred to 30th Infantry Regiment, transferred to Infantry Reserve, June 23, 1919, assigned to 361st Infantry, promoted Captain January 2, 1924, and then inactive on July 26, 1924. On February 9, 1925, he was commissioned Captain, California National Guard and appointed Adjutant, 184th Infantry Regiment. On September 17, 1925, he was

promoted to Major and assigned as Regimental Machine Gun Officer, 184th Infantry Regiment. On March 6, 1926, he was placed in command of the Third Battalion. The promotion of Lieutenant-Colonel Hays led to the appointment of Major Blood as Executive Officer on April 1, 1929, then to Lieutenant-Colonel on June 28, 1929. About a year later, on May 3, 1930, Lieutenant-Colonel Blood was commissioned Colonel, which office he held until October 1, 1937, when he resigned.

Colonel Blood was succeeded by Lieutenant-Colonel Edward J. Murray. Colonel Murray first entered the National Guard as a private in Company G, Second Infantry Regiment on April 25, 1914. He was commissioned Second Lieutenant, Company G, Second Infantry, June 19, 1916, and First Lieutenant on March 31st, 1917. He was mustered into Federal Service for duty on the Mexican Border June 27, 1916, to November 15, 1916. He entered the World War with the Second Infantry Regiment in March, 1917, and served through the conflict in the Second and 160th Infantry Regiments. After the war he joined the Officers Reserve Corps. On April 28, 1925, Colonel Murray was commissioned Captain and assigned to the 184th as Plans and Training Officer. He was promoted to Major March 20, 1926, and on April 1, 1929 was placed in command of the Third Battalion. On May 3, 1930, he was promoted to Lieutenant-Colonel and assigned to the 184th Infantry Regiment. On October 2, 1937, he succeeded Colonel Blood as Colonel of the Regiment, to which rank he was commissioned on November 9, 1937.

A brief study of the history of the majors of the 184th Infantry Regiment reveals that there have been two Majors in the Medical Detachment. When the Regiment was organized, Major Frank K. Pomeroy was Captain in the Medical Detachment of the 159th Infantry Regiment. In 1924 he was transferred to the 184th Infantry and on March 31, 1925 was commissioned Major in the Medical Detachment. When the 185th Infantry was organized April 1, 1929, the entire Medical Detachment of the 184th Infantry Regiment was transferred to the 185th. Major Pomeroy was commissioned and served as First Lieutenant in the Medical Corps during the World War.

A new Medical Detachment was organized in Sacramento and Captain Bert S. Thomas was promoted to Major, Medical Detachment, 184th Infantry Regiment on April 2, 1929. Major Thomas served as Sergeant in the Medical Detachment of the Federal Service from October 16, 1918, to December 11, 1918. Major Thomas was commissioned Captain, Medical Detachment, 184th Infantry Regiment, July 1, 1925.

Francis B. Kimes was promoted Major of the First Battalion, 184th Infantry Regiment, when Major Ray W. Hays was elevated to Lieutenant-Colonel of the Regiment, May 4, 1925. Major Kimes enlisted in Company M, Second Infantry Regiment on November 22, 1911. On January 16, 1915, he was commissioned Second Lieutenant, and on March 28, 1917, entered the World War as Captain of Company M, Second Infantry Regiment, and later on the unit was designated Company E, 160th Infantry Regiment. He was mustered out of Federal Service

June 11, 1919. When Company B, 184th Infantry was organized in Hanford in March, 1924, Major Kimes was commissioned Captain of the unit. On May 4, 1924, he was promoted to Major and assigned to the First Battalion. His life and career ended rather abruptly on February 8, 1929, after undergoing an operation on January 31, 1929.

Captain John B. Maloney succeeded Major Kimes on April 25, 1929 and was commissioned Major on May 28th, 1929. Major Maloney has a long record with the National Guard. On January 7, 1916, he enlisted in Troop B, Cavalry in Sacramento. He was with Troop B on the Mexican Border in 1916, and went into the World War Service, August 5, 1917. He was afterwards transferred to the Infantry where he served until October 18, 1918, when he was commissioned Second Lieutenant. After the War he entered the Officers Reserve Corps. On March 31, 1925, he was commissioned First Lieutenant, California National Guard and assigned to Service Company, 184th Infantry Regiment, was promoted to Captain April 22, 1926, and to Major in 1929, which rank he still holds. On November 1, 1931, Major Maloney was transferred to the Regimental Staff of the 184th. Major Elken J. Plato was transferred from Headquarters and became commander of the First Battalion.

Major Plato joined the Aviation Corps November 30, 1917 as a private and continued therein until July 25, 1919, when he was mustered out of Federal Service. On April 25, 1925, he entered the California National Guard as First Lieutenant and was assigned to Regimental Headquarters as Supply Officer. A few months later, on August 17, 1925, he was commissioned Captain and on May 1, 1930, was promoted to Major and assigned as Plans and Training Officer, 184th Infantry Regiment. From the Plans and Training Office the Major was transferred to the command of the First Battalion of the 184th on November 1, 1930. He is still in that position.

The commanders of the Second Battalion were as follows: Majors Seth Millington, Chauncy T. Bradley, James R. McFarland, Irwin E. Farington, John B. Maloney, and Merl W. Bremer. Major Seth Millington entered the Federal Service August 21, 1917, when he became a private in the Medical Detachment. He remained in the Medical Corps until he was transferred to the Infantry June 6, 1918 as a Second Lieutenant, and was promoted to First Lieutenant September 13, 1918. Major Millington entered the Officers Reserve Corps December 23, 1919. On August 18, 1921, he was commissioned Captain and assigned to the Sixth Separate Company, Infantry, Colusa, which became Company F, 159th Infantry October 1, 1921. On June 25, 1924, he was promoted to Major, 159th Infantry Regiment. When the 184th Infantry Regiment was organized Major Millington was transferred to the command of the Second Battalion of that Regiment. He remained in command of that Battalion until August 27, 1925, when he resigned.

Major Millington was succeeded by Major Chauncey T. Bradley. Major Bradley's military experience in the National Guard of California began February 3, 1916, when he enlisted in Company H, Second Infantry Regiment. A few months after his enlistment he went to the Mexican Border for patrol duty. Company H was mustered out of the Federal Service November 15, 1916. On March 29, 1917, Major Bradley was commissioned Second Lieutenant in Company H, Second Infantry Regiment. With the Second Infantry he went into Federal Service again in April, and on August 5, 1917, Company H, Second Infantry was redesignated Company H, 160th Infantry Regiment. On August 15, 1917, he was promoted to First Lieutenant. He was transferred to the Officers Reserve Corps June 23, 1919. On March 21, 1924, Major Bradley was assigned as Captain of Company H, 184th Infantry Regiment. About a year later he was promoted to Major and assigned to the Regimental Staff. From the Staff he was assigned to the command of the Second Battalion when Major Millington resigned. Major Bradley resigned May 31, 1927. Major Bradley also served three years in the United States Cavalry, from 1900, to 1903.

Major James R. McFarland was the next major to command the Second Battalion. He enlisted in Battery C, First Field Artillery April 2, 1917, and was mustered out April 12, 1919. He was commissioned First Lieutenant Officers Reserve Corps November 24, 1924. On March 20, 1925, he was commissioned First Lieutenant, California National Guard and assigned to the Service Company, 184th Infantry Regiment. He was promoted to Captain and Regimental Adjutant, September 8, 1925. From Adjutant to command of Headquarters Company, then to Howitzer Company, and back to the Staff again in less than two years. On June 15, 1927, Captain McFarland was commissioned Major and placed in command of the Second Battalion, 184th Infantry. Two years as Battalion commander and then, on November 1, 1929, he was returned to the Regimental Staff.

Major Irwin E. Farington was the next major of the Second Battalion. Major Farington enlisted in the Third Company Coast Artillery Corps, California National Guard, August 21st, 1914. With the Third Company entered the Federal Service, August 5, 1917, and served until May 21, 1919. He entered the Officers Reserve Corps as Second Lieutenant on November 29, 1923, and was commissioned Second Lieutenant in the California National Guard May 24, 1924, and assigned to Company H, 184th Infantry Regiment. He was promoted to First Lieutenant February 10, 1925; to Captain November 9, 1925; was advanced to Major October 31, 1929 and placed in command of the Second Battalion. About seven years later, on December 18, 1936, he was transferred to the Regimental Staff and Manor John B. Maloney from the Staff succeeded him. About a year later Major Maloney was returned to the Staff and Merl W. Bremer became major of the Second Battalion.

Major Bremer had joined Company C, Second Infantry Regiment April 2, 1910, and was discharged May 5, 1911. On November 12, 1917, he joined the Engineer Corps for duty during the World War. He was commissioned Second Lieutenant of the 528th Engineers, April 1, 1918. On June 18, 1918, he was promoted to First Lieutenant, and mustered out of Federal Service July 25, 1919. From the Officers Reserve Corps Major Bremer was commissioned First Lieutenant, California National Guard, February 8, 1927, assigned to Company H, 184th Infantry Regiment, and was promoted to Captain May 19, 1929. On May 29, 1936, he was transferred to the Inactive National Guard. On October 4, 1937, he was placed in command of the Second Battalion, in lieu of Major, and was promoted to Major November 9, 1937.

In March, 1926 the Third Battalion of the 184th Infantry was organized and Major Charles R. Blood was transferred from the Regimental Staff to command the Battalion. He retained that command until April 1st, 1929, when he was transferred to the Regimental Staff. Major Edward J. Murray succeeded Major Blood as commander of the Third Battalion. On April 3, 1930, Major Murray was returned to the Regimental Staff and Major McFarland became the new Battalion commander. He retained that position until April 6, 1930, when he also went to the Regimental Staff. Major Roy A. Green, who was commissioned Major April 6, 1937, was placed in command of the Third Battalion. Major Green was a private and a non-commissioned officer in the Medical Detachment during the World War, October 26, 1918, to December 11, 1918. On October 26, 1925, he was commissioned First Lieutenant, Medical Corps, 184th Infantry Regiment. He resigned June 30, 1926, and the following day, July 1, 1926, was commissioned Second Lieutenant of Infantry and assigned to Headquarters Company, 184th Infantry Regiment. On February 8, 1927, he was promoted to Captain, and on April 6, 1937, was promoted to Major and placed in command of the Third Battalion. On October 6, 1937, Major Green was transferred to the Regimental Staff, and Earl E. Retzer became the new Major of the Third Battalion. Major Retzer, like several other officers of the 184th, had served with the Engineers during the World War, and was a member of the 403rd Engineer Depot. He was commissioned First Lieutenant October 3, 1918. After his discharge from the United States Army he joined the Officers Reserve Corps, where he served until June 1, 1929, when he accepted a commission as Second Lieutenant, California National Guard, and was assigned to Company L, 184th Infantry. A few months later, December 20, 1929, Lieutenant Retzer was promoted to Captain, and on June 24, 1937, was advanced to Major and placed in command of the Third Battalion. He was still Major in that Battalion on December 31, 1937.

From the military record of the commanding officers we proceed to the record of the activities of the Regiment. The first activity of consequence was on Thanksgiving day, November 24, 1927, when approximately fourteen hundred rioting convicts of Folsom Prison took possession of the prison library, and upon request of the Warden, Governor C. C. Young immediately ordered out Headquarters and eight units of the 184th Infantry Regiment. The order, a verbal one, required the companies, "To mobilize at their respective armories, and with or without uniforms, be transported to Folsom as rapidly as possible." The rapidity of this mobilization of the Guardsmen was one of the outstanding features of the day. They were on duty from about noon, Thursday, November 24, 1927, to Friday morning, the twenty-fifth. Two paragraphs from the pen of Chaplain Bryant Wilson, of the 184th Infantry virtually tells the rest of the story. "The Guardsmen were told not to fire until they received orders to do so and it is a remarkable tribute to their good discipline that not a shot was fired by a Guardsman, although the peace officers beside them poured two thousand or more shots into the library where the convicts were barricaded.

Major Charles Blood stated that the most vivid recollection of the affair in his mind was the grim look on the faces of the men, when, with fixed bayonets, in the cold gray dawn, they entered the prison walls, not knowing whether a volley of death might not greet them at any moment. "All behaved splendidly. The discipline was of the highest order." The only casualty was a flesh wound in the cheek, received by a member of the Howitzer Company.*

The next call to service came on July 5th, 1934. The Longshoremen's strike in San Francisco resulted in serious disorder, eventually resulting in the calling out of the National Guard by Governor Merriam to restore order. On July five, Companies D, K, L, M, and Battalion Headquarters were ordered to San Francisco. A detachment from Company A was ordered to guard the Armory and State Arsenal in Sacramento. On July six, Companies G, and C were called, and the following day part of the Medical Detachment was called. Increasing fear of trouble caused the calling out, on July 17, and 18th, all the remaining troops of the 184th Infantry Regiment, excepting Companies E, F, and I. The troops of the 184th Infantry were relieved from active duty at about 5:30 p.m. on July twenty-one.

Departing from active military duty this narrative will describe activities of a more pleasant character. The presentation of the Regiment's newly authorized colors will be first. The time chosen

was during the annual encampment in August, 1927, the place was the Del Monte Camp Site, near Santa Cruz, and the particular day was Governor's Day. The authorized coat of arms is very distinctive, and the description of same, given by the War Department was as follows:

"The 184th Infantry shield is azure, a chevron between a battle axe, a giant cactus and a fleur-de-lis. The azure is the Infantry color. The battle axe signifies the Sarasfield Grenadier Guard, which was the original Sacramento military organization, dating back to the 50's, which in 1870 was organized as a National Guard Company. The Grenadiers used the battle axe as part of their drill paraphernalia. The cactus signifies Mexican Border Service. The Fleur-de-lis and the chevron signify service in France, extending over a period of six months."

Under Order No. 16, War Department, the 184th Infantry is entitled to bear on its color a streamer in the colors of the Victory ribbon with no inscription. At the presentation services, Company F was designated the color company, and Company C as escort to the colors. Following the services the Regiment passed in review before Colonel W. A. Mason and Staff.*

The fact that the various units of the 184th Infantry Regiment were located in many cities in the Sacramento Valley made it difficult and expensive to hold a regimental parade except at the annual encampments. Probably Armistice Day, 1928, was the only occasion on which the Regiment as a whole was viewed by Sacramentans. It was the tenth anniversary of the signing of the Armistice and a splendid parade and celebration was planned. The following article, taken from a local daily paper tells the story:

"Armistice Day was fittingly observed in Sacramento with the National Guard taking a leading part in the day's activities. The 184th Infantry men gathered from all points of the compass to have a part in the festivities. The day began with a parade when the National Guard units and Civic organizations joined in a march through the rain, reminding them of the days in France and Belgium. The turnout was the largest parade of soldiers that Sacramento had seen for many years, not since 1916, when the old National Guard of California was mobilized at the State Fair grounds for Mexican Border Service. Besides the National Guard, 200 sailors, 100 high school cadets and 200 Boy Scouts participated. Major Blood and staff were followed by the Stockton Legion Drum Corps and drill team. Next came the American Legion Band of Sacramento, followed by the massed colors and by the high

school cadets. Then came the Navy band and the Naval detachment of 200 gobs. Last but not least of course, came the 184th Infantry Regiment band, followed by the 184th Infantry Regiment. In the afternoon, exercises were held in the big new Stadium at Sacramento. After the ceremony of flag raising etc. the troops paraded around the Stadium, and the 184th Infantry staged a battalion review, ending the military part of the program.**

The record of drill attendance in the 184th Infantry seems to be a weak spot in an otherwise good regiment. The yearly attendance at drills, when compared with the other regiments of the California National Guard was as follows: In 1926, the 184th was second highest; in 1927, third; in 1928, sixth; in 1930, fourth, and in 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1935, and 1936 was seventh or last on the list. The record does not mean that the whole regiment was slack in regard to attendance, since there were always some units of the 184th in the excellent rating class. The yearly attendance average of the National Guard increased considerably since 1925, when the 184th was second, with a percentage of 68.28%, while in 1936, the percentage was 78.64%, yet it was seventh in rating.

Nearly every one is aware of the fact that the National Guard attends annual encampments, where modern war tactics are taught by competent officials. Each year the 184th Infantry Regiment attended the encampment. There is no practical way to compare one regiment with another in camp, since usually one will excel in one respect and be weak in some other test. There are usually several outstanding units in each regiment, but this is a story of the Regiment and is not intended to rate the various units within the Regiment. The same is true regarding rifle practice and marksmanship. Good marksmanship is a very essential quality in a soldier, and the National Guard of California has developed many splendid marksmen.

The social life of the 184th Infantry was not neglected. Each unit in its own locality has developed a splendid social atmosphere. Holiday parades and entertainments are always appreciated by the citizens of the state.

In closing, it is a pleasure to reflect that the 184th Infantry Regiment of 1937 is a far superior organization to that of 1924, and the United States War Department is planning to further increase the already high proficiency of the National Guard until it shall become a chief factor in the country's defense.
