196TH FIELD ARTILLERY

Activities:

The existence of the 196th Field Artillery was short. It remained as the 196th Field Artillery for approximately three months, then became part of the 144th Field Artillery.

In April 1936, the Santa Barbara Chamber of Commerce sponsored a civic dinner in honor of the muster of Hemdquarters Battery and Combat Train, Second Battalion, 196th Field Artillery, organized April 15, 1936, and the ceremony of redesignating Battery E, 143rd Field Artillery, which took place April 14, 1936. Brigadier General H. M. Morehead, the Adjutant General, and Brigadier General Walter P. Story, commanding the Southern California units were both present. After the celebration, General Morehead proceeded to Ventura, where he and Major Ralph A. Coane, the commander of the 196th Field Artillery, mustered the new Battery D, 196th Field Artillery, organized April 16, 1936.

April 16, 1936, was also the date of organisation of Headquarters Second Battalion, at Santa Barbara. On May 28, 1936, the Medical Department Detachment, Second Battalion was organised, completing the organisation of the 196th field Artillery.

The Officers and men of the 196th were a "lively bunch", and prepared with a will to attend the encampment to be held in August, but the demobilisation of their Company upset their plans.

The 196th Field Artillery was ably commanded by Major Ralph W. Coane, who was formerly Captain of Battery B, 143rd Field Artillery and was promoted Major to take over the command of the 196th.

On July 1, 1936, by direction of the Secretary of War, the 196th Field Artillery was demobilised and the 144th Field Artillery reconstituted. All units and personnel of the 196th were transferred to similar units and grades in the 144th Field Artillery.*
