## Ictivities:

Machine Gun Troop, First Squadron of Cavalry was mustered into the service of the State of California, July 16, 1917, in accordance with Special Order No. 60, Adjutant General's Office, dated July 11, 1917. Captain Henry H, Sydenbaum of Troop B, First Squadron of Cavalry, California National Guard, Stationed at Sacramento, California, was detailed to muster the new Machine Gun Troop into the service of the State at Fresno. The Machine Gun Tro p had an enrolled membership of ninety-five men. Lloyd T. Stephenson was chosen Captain and Frank G. Everts First Lieutenant.

The Machine Gun Troop was called into the Federal Service August 5, 1917, and on August 14, 1917, entrained at Fresno for Mobilization Camp at Arcadia, California, arriving there August 15, 1917. The Troop remained in Mobilization Camp at Arcadia until mustered into the service of the United States on August 24th, 1917, for duty during the World War.
