## J ivitios:

On January 16, 1922, a unit designated as Headquarters Detachment and Combat Train, First Separate Battalion, Field Artillery, California National Guard, was organised in the city of Oakland. On January 17th, First Lieutenant D. L. Marshall of Battery A. Field Artillery, California National Guard, was assigned to command the new organisation in addition to his duties as First Lieutenant of Battery A. On June 8, 1922, Headquarters Detachment and Combat Train was recognised by the Federal Government as a unit of the National Guard. First Lieutenant Marshall was commissioned Captain and placed in command of the unit.

The first major event in the activities of this unit occurred in July, 1922, when the Battery journeyed to Camp Lewis, Washington, where they attended a fifteen day Field Training Encampment in conjunction with regular United States Army Troops, commencing July 15th.

Headquarters Detachment and Combat Train attended routine weekly drill exercises and participated in various civic activities until September 1924. On September 5, 1924, General Order No. 57, redesignated the unit as Head Quarters Battery, 143rd Field Artillery.
