Although Battery F was organized as a National Guard unit, on August 4, 1917 it was, as a part of the Second Field Artillery, mustered into Federal Service August 5, 1917. At the time of entering the Federal Service, Battery F was redesignated as Battery P, 144th Field Artillery Regiment.***
