August 4, 1917

Activities:

Headquarters Company, Second Field Artillery, was organized August 4, 1917 as a unit of the California National Guard. The following day, (August 5, 1917), the company with other organizations of the National Guard, was, pursuant to the proclamation of the President of the United States, dated July 5, 1917, mustered into Federal Service for duty in the World War. Upon entering Federal Service, the company was redesignated as Headquarters Company, 144th Field Artillery, and was with the other companies of the Second Field Artillery, ordered overseas.
