ACTIVITIES

The Sanitary Corps, Fifth Infantry Regiment was organized in Oakland, California January 3, 1898. Details of the organization of the unit could not be found in the records of the Fifth Infantry Regiment. Monthly Detachment Returns beginning in March, 1904 is the oldest documents available.

The detachment consisted of twelve members in March, 1904. In Bebruary 1917 the detachment had an enrollment of 23 members.

The Sanitary Detachment as a part of the Fifth Infantry Regiment was mustered into Federal Service June 28, 1916 for duty on the Mexican Border, serving until October 7, when the regiment was mustered out.

On March 26, 1917, the Fifth Infantry Regiment was called into Federal Service for duty during the World War. The Sanitary Detachment was mustered into Federal Service April 10, 1917, and on September 24, 1917, was redesignated Medical Detachment 159th Infantry Regiment, 40th Division.
