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### FINAL PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT REPORT ANTIOCH BOMBING TARGET

#### 1.0 Introduction

TechLaw, Inc. (TechLaw) received Task Order No. 0015 under contract DACW05-95-D-0004 to provide services to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers - Sacramento District (USACE). This Task Order requested the development of preliminary assessments for eleven suspected, World War II era, gunnery and bombing ranges. These sites were identified by USACE through a variety of sources. The eleven sites include Trinidad Bombing Target, Gualala Bombing Target, Jenner Bombing Target, Petaluma Bombing Target, Antioch Bombing Target, Stockton Ordnance Depot, Lake Chabot Gunnery Range, Livermore Rifle Range, Livermore Auxiliary Field, NAAS Vernalis, and Gustine Bombing Target. Individual reports have been prepared by TechLaw for each of these eleven sites.

TechLaw's primary researcher for the development of this Preliminary Assessment was Betty Henkle (916) 557-6826 and the TechLaw Project Manager was Gene Barber (303) 763-8881.

#### 1.1 Objectives of the Report

In preparing this Preliminary Assessment Report TechLaw has addressed each of the tasks specified in the Scope of Work for this assignment. The purpose of this Preliminary Assessment (PA) Report is to provide the USACE information regarding the Department of Defense' (DoD) interest in the site and to determine if this site should be considered a formerly used defense site (FUDS).

This report addresses the former and current ownership of the site, and the historical and current use of the site. Due to the limited information available at the onset of the research detailed herein, it was necessary for TechLaw to determine the approximate physical boundaries of the site. In some cases the lack of physical boundaries affected TechLaw's ability to compile a complete ownership history for the site.

TechLaw attempted to identify the types of ordnance used at the site and the specific location(s) where related activities took place. Based on the scope of work for this assignment historical records were reviewed at the San Bruno National Archives, several archives in the Washington, D.C. area, one local historical repository, and the offices of the local county Assessor and Recorder. In most cases TechLaw also made several personal contacts in an attempt to develop the history of the site.

Throughout the development of the site history there are gaps in historical data and occasional conflicts between sources. TechLaw has identified datagaps and conflicts where they occur in the text of the report.

In an attempt to provide complete information and a thorough evaluation of the site, TechLaw has conducted a site visit to gather additional information and record the current condition of the site. TechLaw staff recorded the current state of this site both on film and video tape. The video tape documenting the results of the site visits is included in the file for the Stockton Ordnance Depot.

Finally, TechLaw was required to evaluate the potential for hazards at the site and to complete an Ordnance and Explosive Risk Assessment Code (RAC) for the site. The RAC for this site has been provided as Appendix 5.

#### 1.2 Site Background

The Antioch Bombing Target is located approximately 11 miles east of Antioch, in Contra Costa County, California, in Township 2 North Range 3 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian (Figure 1). The nearest major road is Highway 160. The Antioch Bombing Target was located in Divisions C and D in what was known as the Subdivisions of the Lands of Franks Reclamation Company (CA0018). These divisions total approximately 992.92 acres of what is now submerged land. According to the California Department of Parks and Recreation, Brannon Island District, Rio Vista, California, this area became submerged during the 1930s. This area is currently known as Frank's Tract and will be referred to as such throughout the remainder of this report.

This area is popular for sightseeing, water sports, fishing, and picnicking. The area around the Antioch Bombing Target contains housing, marinas, fuel stations, and restaurants.

#### 1.3 Organization of the Report


This Preliminary Assessment report is organized in the following manner:

<u>Section 2.0 - Ownership History</u> - This section of the report discusses the ownership history of the facility in question. It discusses the specific property and follows a basic chain of ownership from the 1930s to the present. Transactions are discussed in chronological order and properties are depicted on a real estate map.

<u>Section 3.0 - Department of Defense Operations</u> - Section 3 of the report provides a detailed discussion regarding the historical use of the site and focuses on DoD operations specifically. This section of the report is divided into subsections which relate to specific areas of interest. TechLaw has provided a map which delineates the specific areas of interest (Figure 3).

<u>Section 4.0 - Subsequent Development of the Site</u> - TechLaw has evaluated the development of the Antioch Bombing Target subsequent to World War II and use by DoD, and included the results of this research in Section 4 of the report.

<u>Section 5.0 - Results of the Site Visit</u> - Section 5.0 of this Preliminary Assessment Report contains a written summary of the observations made during TechLaw's visit to the site. The scope of the site visit included observations made from roads and publicly accessible trails. No sub-surface investigation was conducted. These results refer to the still photographs included in Appendix 3 of this report.

#### 2.0 Ownership History: Antioch Bombing Target 1906 to Present

TechLaw evaluated the real estate history of the property that contains the Antioch Bombing Target by reviewing records at the Contra Costa County Assessor's and County Recorder's Office located in Martinez, California and at the National Archives in San Bruno. Grantee and Grantor indices were examined from the 1900s to the 1960s to determine if the United States obtained an interest in land in the area of the Antioch Bombing Target. Although TechLaw has not developed a complete chain-of-title for the Antioch Bombing Target, it has compiled a fairly complete overview of the ownership history of the target area.


The property which TechLaw has evaluated is included on the Contra Costa Assessor Map, Book 25, pages 3 and 4 (CA0012 and CA0013) and in Book B of Maps, page 40 of the County Recorder's Office (CA0018). Descriptions of the property noted below refer to Assessor parcel numbers (APNs) which consist of the book and page of the map and the individual parcel number (e.g., 25-004-008, 025-004-004). Figure 2 is a composite of the two Assessor maps and depicts all of the property discussed below. Parcel numbers are circled on the map and appear as two digit numbers. The property TechLaw has determined to contain the Antioch Bombing Target consists of Division C, Parcels 025-004-008, 025-004-007, 025-004-006, 025-004-005, 025-004-004, 025-004-001 and Division D Parcel 025-004-001, 025-004-002, 025-004-003, and 025-004-004. The property discussed in this report consists of Divisions C and D and will be referred to as such throughout the remainder of this report.


#### 2.1 Antioch Bombing Target Property History

In 1906, the area containing the Antioch Bombing Target was owned by Dr. N.K. Foster and F.C. Franks according to Book B of Maps, page 40 (CA0018). In a Deed recorded on March 29, 1913, Fred C. Franks and his wife conveyed an undivided one-half interest of Division D (Frank's Tract) to John Markley and Ada R. Markley of Sutter County, California (CR0018).

According to a property acquisition map dated November 23, 1943, the Regents of the University of California, Berkeley, California (Regents of California) owned Division D, containing 502.25 acres (SB0212).

A Renewal of Government Lease executed on May 15, 1951, extended the period of performance for Lease NOy(R)35540 from July 1, 1951 through June 30, 1952. Lease NOy(R)35540 was executed between the United States as Lessee and The Regents of the University of California as Lessor on February 1, 1944 for 992.92 acres (SB0084). A memorandum dated November 21, 1944, concerning real estate activity at Air Facilities, states there was a Lease (NOy(R)35540) for 502.25 acres. According to other documentation, this Lease was renegotiated from 1952 to 1954 (SB0084, SB0069, SB0045, SB0055, SB0056, AND SB0059). TechLaw was unable to obtain any of the actual Leases for this property.

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According to a letter from the Twelfth Naval District dated July 7, 1944, Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) had a power line that bisected Division D (CP0006). TechLaw was unable to obtain any records indicating an easement for PG&E. The target was moved from Division D to Division C because of the hazard of the PG&E power line according to an acquisition map dated November 1945 (Figure 3 and SB0208).

According to the memorandum dated November 21, 1944, there was an exchange of land by revocable permits between the California Peat Company and the Government and that the permits were executed and transmitted on September 22, 1944 (SB0109). A letter dated September 24, 1945, states that a revocable permit from California Peat Company and a revocable permit from the Government to California Peat Company were forwarded to the Bureau of Yards and Docks on July 7, 1944, for execution and approval. These permits covered 500 acres adjoining the property covered by Lease NOy(R)35540 and were to be used by the Government for bombing operations (SB0108). Although no specific description of the property is provided it appears that this acreage equals that of Division C.

On April 5, 1945, The Regents of California conveyed a one-half interest of Division D (Frank's Tract) to Carl and Nancy Newbury and Lawrence and Maude Mehaffey by Deed recorded in Book 600, page 210. The Regents of California retained all mineral rights to Division D (CR0021).

California Peat Company conveyed 502.25 acres of Division D to the State of California by Deed recorded on April 4, 1960, in Book 3653, page 304 (CR0022). The Regents of California also conveyed 502.25 acres of Division D, including the mineral rights, to the State of California by Deed recorded on April 6, 1960, in Book 3653, page 308 (CR0023).

California Peat Company conveyed all of Division C to the State of California by Deed recorded on February 8, 1961, in Book 3900, page 486 and by Deed recorded on August 24, 1960, in Book 3823, page 601 (CR0020 and CR0019). According to the Deeds recorded in 1960 and 1961, L.W. Mehaffey and Carl Newbury were the secretary and vice president of the California Peat Company (CR0018 and CR0019).

Currently, the property known as Frank's Tract is owned and operated by the California Department of Parks and Recreation, Brannon Island, Rio Vista, California (NS0006).

#### 3.0 Department of Defense Operations at Antioch Bombing Target

As outlined in the Scope of Work for the Preliminary Assessments, TechLaw has contacted state, federal, and local agencies, libraries, and historical societies in search of information regarding this site. Information regarding this site was limited and there is very little detail concerning the specific activities of DoD. The information provided below is a summary of DoD's operations at Antioch Bombing Target. This information was obtained from oral accounts and written documentation regarding the Antioch Bombing Target and the surrounding areas. TechLaw has delineated the various locations of the Antioch Bombing Target on Figure 3.

#### 3.1 Antioch Bombing Target

According to a letter dated November 28, 1952, discussing the renegotiation of Lease NOy(R)35540 covering 992.21 acres for the Antioch Dive Bombing Target, the Lease stipulated that the Lessor (California Peat Company) was allowed to dig peat in this area. It also states that the California Peat Company was required to advise two weeks in advance of any proposed digging operations in the vicinity of the target, so that the target structures could be either moved or closed for the period of the digging operations. A request was also made to allow sportsmen to fish in the subject area. The Navy disagreed with this arrangement, stating that it would be with "consequent liability" of the Navy in case of injury or death attributable to dive bombing or rocket training. The letter also states that there was an urgent requirement for an indefinite period of time for this target site. Squadrons trained in this area played a large part in fighting in Korea. It was recommended that additional effort be made to negotiate an acceptable lease or that consideration be given to condemnation to obtain the continued use of the target area (SB0055).

An attachment to a letter dated May 11, 1953, discussing Naval Air Targets, Gunnery and Bombing Areas, 12th Naval District, states the Antioch Bombing Target consisted of a floating target on inland waters at Latitude 38-02-30N and Longitude 121-37-00N. The bombing practice normally consisted of air to ground rockets and miniature bombs. The target area was temporarily closed pending renewal of the lease by condemnation proceedings. TechLaw was unable to obtain any documents pertaining to the condemnation proceedings (SB0044).

#### 3.2 Deactivation of the Antioch Bombing Target

A Naval speed letter dated January 7, 1954, states the Navy used the Antioch Bombing Target continuously from 1943 until the Lease by the Navy expired on October 27, 1952. In the Naval speed letter, the Commandant of the 12th Naval District, was advised of the interest of the sportsmen and recreational groups in Frank's Tract and that the State Parks Commission was seriously considering establishment of a State Aquatic Park in the area. The Commandant also received numerous letters from sportsmen associations and their representatives protesting the acquisition. The Navy considered that the resultant adverse public relations would be most detrimental to the Navy and should be avoided. Renegotiations of the Lease were unsuccessful and the Navy withdrew the request for the target and all Naval District interest in Frank's Tract was terminated (SB0043).

#### 4.0 Subsequent Development at the Antioch Bombing Target

According to Randy Riblet and Jay Galloway, California Department of Parks and Recreation, Frank's Tract is currently used for fishing, duck hunting, sightseeing, and boating. The area which contained the Antioch Bombing Target is under approximately 20 feet of water and contains duck blinds. The area immediately surrounding the location of the former target area is completely undeveloped and consists of open water. Located approximately 1.25 miles from the target area and 75 feet from the western shore of Frank's Tract is Bethel Island. Bethel Island consists of homes, restaurants, marinas, and fueling stations. This island is separated from Frank's Tract by a cement sea wall constructed by the California Department of Parks and Recreation.

#### 5.0 Results of Site Visit

A site visit was conducted on January 28, 1999, of the Antioch Bombing Target to make observations about the current condition of the site and to attempt to identify any features that might relate to the operations of the DoD. Betty Henkle and Gene Barber of TechLaw conducted the site visit. Video tape and photographs were taken to document the features of the site. The photographs that were taken are incorporated in this report as Appendix 3. The video tape of the site will be delivered to USACE with the Final Preliminary Assessment Report.

In order to conduct a site visit of the Antioch Bombing Target it was necessary to request the assistance of the California Department of Parks and Recreation. TechLaw personnel arrived at Brannon Island Park, Rio Vista, California at approximately 10:00 a.m. The skies were foggy and visibility was minimal. Randy Riblet and Dennis Pruitt, from the California Department of Parks and Recreation transported the TechLaw staff by boat to the area called Frank's Tract. In order to reach Frank's Tract the boat passed through Three Mile Slough, crossed over the San Joaquin River, past Twitchell Island and Bethel Island, False River, and into what is referred to as Little Frank's Tract. Bethel Island is located approximately 1.25 miles from the Antioch Bombing Target across Piper Slough and contains housing, restaurants, marinas, and fuel stations (Photograph Nos. 1, 3, and 5). Due to the erosion of the levees and Frank's Tract being rich in peat soil, a sea wall was built by the California Department of Parks and Recreation by the request of the homeowners and businesses along Frank's Tract to keep debris off the island and to keep the surrounding areas from washing away. On the east side of the sea wall is the area known as Frank's Tract. According to Randy Riblet this area was submerged in the 1930s and remains under approximately 20 feet of water. Frank's Tract consists of open water and although the area of the target was fully covered by boat, TechLaw personnel w unable to locate any signs of DoD activities or any debris left from the bombing target (photograph Nos. 1, 3, and 5).

#### 5.1 Conclusions from Site Visit

As a result of the site visit that TechLaw has conducted on the Antioch Bombing Target and its surrounding areas the following conclusions have been developed:

- The former location of the Antioch Bombing Target is widely used by the public for recreational purposes.
- The areas surrounding the target are occupied by homes, marinas, restaurants and fuel stations.
- The water-borne gunnery and bombing targets referenced in this report appear
  to have been removed and any debris that remains is submerged under
  approximately 20-feet of water.

#### 6.0 Conclusions

The following conclusions are based on the results of the research presented in the previous sections of this report.

#### 6.1 Conclusions

As a result of the research that TechLaw has conducted on the Antioch Bombing Target and its surrounding areas the following conclusions have been developed:

- TechLaw has determined that there is sufficient documented evidence to support the fact that DoD used the Antioch Bombing Target and the surrounding area for target and/or bombing practice from WWII through the early 1950s.
- The areas surrounding the target have been developed for recreational and residential use. The Target itself remains submerged under approximately 20 feet of water.
- No physical evidence exists that the site was used by DoD.
- Documented evidence exists that bombing practice consisted of air to ground rockets and miniature M23 bombs (Huckins, February 4, 1999).



Interference, however, will be eliminated by the use of the proposed new area in conjunction with the "Area D".
- The subject project does not represent an increase in scope of existing facilities or establish any new facilities for which Naval personnel will be required, other than that already assigned to NAS, Alameda. This information is given in conformance with SecNav confidential directive, (SC) P16-1/EN dated 26 January 1944 re Employment of Personnel.

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#### **PREFACE**

The Delta Protection Commission was formed as a result of State legislation passed in 1992. The legislation states "the delta's waterways and marinas...[and] recreational boating within the delta is of statewide and local significance and is a source of economic benefit to the region..."(Public Resources Code Section 29712).

The Commission was charged with developing a "comprehensive long-term resource management plan for land uses within the primary zone of the delta" including "preserve and protect open-space and outdoor recreation opportunities" and "preserve and protect opportunities for controlled public access and use of public lands and waterways consistent with the protection of natural resources and private property interests" and preserve, protect, and maintain navigation".

The Commission prepared a series of background reports, including one on recreation and access, which noted a lack of current data on recreational uses of the Delta Primary Zone. The Commission and the Department of Boating and Waterways entered into a contract with the Department of Parks and Recreation to prepare a user survey [see Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Recreation Survey, August 1997]. In addition, the Commission's staff was directed to prepare a survey of recreational facilities in the Delta, focusing on the Primary Zone.

This survey of recreation facilities does not adequately describe the scope and extent of recreation in the Delta, because those facilities serve many individuals who come from out of the Delta to use the Delta waterways. For example, the number and location of launch ramps does not adequately indicate the number of users of the waterways, nor does it adequately describe the economic impacts of recreationalists in the Delta.

The Delta is part of an extensive area of waterways that cover San Francisco Bay, and stretch north and south along the rivers in the Delta watershed. Within the Legal Delta, water covers approximately 61,000 acres of the 738,493 acres; the Primary Zone is 51,000 acres of water covered area within the total 491,774 acre area (Department of Water Resources, Report on Land Use Patterns in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, 1993).

The regional population for the Bay Area is approximately 6.5 million with another two million persons in Sacramento, San Joaquin, and Yolo Counties. This creates a pool of 8.5 million persons of potential recreationalists within a reasonable travel distance of the Delta.

While the inventory of marinas in the Legal Delta indicates over 12,000 berths, the number of registered vessels in the nine Bay Area counties and the Delta counties total almost 250,000 (Department of Motor Vehicles, Total Vessel Registration by County as of December 31, 1996); which is more than 28% of vessels registered Statewide. Sacramento and San Joaquin Counties alone have 67,613 registered vessels

including anything from a large sailing vessel to a personal watercraft (aka jet ski).

Statewide, of the 881,092 vessels registered with Department of Motor Vehicles, more than half are less than 16 feet in length. About one-third of those small vessels are "jet" propelled, and a little less than half are outboards. Many of these vessels are stored at home-- in driveways and garages throughout the region.

Vessels of varying sizes are stored in the hundreds of dry storage spaces located in and around the Delta region. While many marinas provide dry storage spaces (13 in the Delta area are listed in the 1997 Cal/North Directory) almost twice as many dry land storage facilities are located in and around the Delta region (24 are listed in the 1997 Cal/North Directory).

In addition to the large number of people served by the recreational opportunities in the Delta, there is a large economic benefit to the region and the State as a whole. A 1997 report prepared for Department of Boating and Waterways indicated gross receipts statewide of over \$28 million from dry storage; \$178 million from marinas (wet storage); \$123 million from launching fees; almost \$11 million from marina service stations; \$1.1 billion from boat dealers; and \$78 million from personal watercraft dealers. Boaters impact spending on other industries, such as groceries, restaurants, gas stations and drugstores in connection with their boating activities. The 1995 expenditures in these non-boating industries by boaters statewide totaled \$1.3 billion. Lastly, the survey looked at taxes generated by the boating industry; including state taxes generated (personal and corporate income taxes, gasoline taxes, and boat licensed and fees); local property taxes (boats, marinas, and other boating businesses); and other local revenues (sales tax and business licenses). For the entire State, those revenues were over \$588 million in 1995.

Recreational facilities in the Delta should be evaluated along with the survey of users prepared by the Department of Parks and Recreation for the Delta Protection Commission and the Department of Boating and Waterways. The inventory of facilities is intended to gather into one document information about public and private facilities which provide recreational opportunities in the Delta area which takes advantage of the unique Delta resources, particularly the waters of the Delta.

The inventory of recreational facilities is not intended to be a guidebook, merely a resource for private and public planners, and the general public interested in what types of recreation facilities are located in the Delta. The inventory does include information about how to obtain specific information about the recreation facilities listed in the inventory.

#### INTRODUCTION

#### **Background**

In May of 1995, the Delta Protection Commission and the Department of Boating and Waterways entered into an agreement with the Department of Parks and Recreation to study recreation uses of the Delta, focusing on boating and fishing. Department of Water Resources contributed in-kind services and staff hours. The purpose of the study is to provide current recreational use figures for the entire Legal Delta for use by the Commission and by other federal, State, regional and local agencies in their planning processes.

A Recreation Oversight Subcommittee was appointed by the Commission. Members include Commissioner Don Nottoli, Supervisor, Sacramento County, as Chair; Commissioner Bill Curry, Department of Boating and Waterways; Commissioner Donald Murphy, Director, Department of Parks and Recreation; Judy Higley as staff representative for Department of Water Resources; Warden Mervin Hee for Department of Fish and Game; and citizen members: Sally Shanks, Staten Island, San Joaquin County; Chris Lauritzen, Harbormaster, Lauritzen Yacht Harbor, Antioch; Steve Woodard, Herman and Helen's Marina, San Joaquin County; and Gil Labrie, Labrie Architects, Sacramento County. The group met several times to review the questionnaires and help oversee the survey process, and to review the survey results.

As part of the overall work program prepared by the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Delta Protection Commission staff prepared an inventory of Delta recreational facilities. The task is described "Identify and inventory existing recreation facilities and other recreation opportunitiesàldentify and document current recreation opportunities in the Delta: inventory and map existing parks, fishing access locations, and other public recreation lands/facilities; inventory and map hunting clubs, yachting clubs, and other private recreational opportunities; inventory and map private property used for informal recreation; and inventory significant historical and cultural resources." The inventory focuses on sites in the Primary Zone, with some sites in the Secondary Zone where those sites take advantage of the waterways and resources of the Primary Zone.

# **Preparation of Inventory**

The inventory was prepared by gathering and reviewing a number of written sources, and verified through a site visit to each site. The site visits were completed in October of 1995; new information has been added since that time to update the inventory. Each site has an inventory sheet and each site was mapped on USGS quad maps of the Delta. The information was gathered using a Department of Boating and Waterways inventory of

marinas, and numerous other sources including marina listings, magazines, guidebooks, maps, local planning reports and documents, newspaper articles, and other sources (see references).

The sites have been mapped in the Commission's Geographic Information System prepared by Teale Data Center, the Commission's mapping consultant. Preliminary versions of the listings and maps were reviewed by local government planning and recreation departments, the Oversight Subcommittee, and the Recreation Citizens Advisory Committee.

# **Presentation of the Inventory**

The information in the inventory is presented two ways: County by County, and by Type of Recreational Facility. In each presentation the information is presented three ways. First, there is a written description of the facilities, followed by a chart of the inventory information, and, finally, a map illustrating the geographic distribution of the recreational facilities.

The numbering system is organized by County: Solano County begins with #1; Yolo County begins with #50; Sacramento County begins with #100; San Joaquin County begins with #200; and Contra Costa County begins with #300.

The charts presenting County-by-County information are organized by type of facility starting with marinas, and followed by, launch ramps, yacht clubs, fishing access, parks, preserves, and, lastly, other types of facilities.

The charts presenting facilities by type, are organized by County starting with Solano County, and followed by Yolo, Sacramento, San Joaquin, and Contra Costa Counties.

A list of maps, Internet sites, booklets, and books prepared for use by the general public is included at the end of the report. The price and information on where to obtain this information is also included.

# DESCRIPTION OF RECREATIONAL FACILITIES COUNTY BY COUNTY

# **Solano County**

Solano CountyÆs Delta lands lie on the western edge of the Legal Delta covering about 86,000 acres, or approximately 17 percent of the Primary Zone. The land includes property to the east and the west of the Sacramento Deep Water Ship Channel, and to the west of the western levee of the Yolo Bypass. Islands and tracts in the Primary Zone include: Hastings Tract, Prospect Island, and Ryer Island. Waterways in the County include Barker Slough, Cache Slough, Hastings Cut, Hoss Slough, Lindsey Slough, Sacramento River, and the Sacramento Deep Water Ship Channel. The City of Rio Vista is largely outside the Legal Delta, with a small area in the Primary Zone.

Solano County has three marinas, all privately owned. Two of the marinas qualify as "medium" marinas and the third is a "large" marina. Arrowhead Harbor, on Prospect Island by Miner Slough, has 76 berths, is a "medium" marina (between 50 to 200 berths). Arrowhead also has a launch ramp and picnic facilities. Snug Harbor Resort on Ryer Island by Steamboat Slough is another "medium" marina with 100 berths, a launch ramp, 88 camping sites, picnicking facilities, and a fishing pier. Both of these marinas are within the Primary Zone of the Delta. The CountyÆs "large" marina is Delta Marina located in Rio Vista on the Sacramento River out of the Legal Delta, but directly adjacent to the waters of the Primary Zone. Delta Marina includes 275 berths, a launch ramp, 25 RV camping sites, and a pump-out.

There are five launching facilities within Solano County. Three ramps are in the private marinas (see above). Two public ramps are located at Rio Vista Fishing Access in Rio Vista on the Sacramento River and at Sandy Beach Park south of Rio Vista also on the Sacramento River. The public ramps are outside the Legal Delta.

Camping in Solano County is provided at three locations including: Delta Marina, with 25 camping sites; Snug Harbor Resort, with 88 camping sites; and Sandy Beach Park, with 42 camping sites.

Picnic areas are located at several sites in Solano County including: Arrowhead Harbor, Snug Harbor Resort, Rio Vista Fishing Access, Rio Vista Riverbank Fishing Access, Sandy Beach Park, and the Western Railway Museum.

Formal fishing access is provided at Snug Harbor Resort, which is privately owned; at a pier in Sandy Beach Park which is a County Regional Park with camp sites, a trail, picnic sites, and a launch ramp; and at the two fishing sites in Rio Vista: Rio Vista Public Fishing Access and at a pier at the Rio Vista Riverbank Fishing Access.

Trails are located at Sandy Beach Park and at the Nature ConservancyÆs Jepson Prairie Preserve located on Calhoun Cut near Barker Slough.

There are two private Yacht Clubs in Solano County. One is located outside the boundaries of the Legal Delta in Rio Vista; one is in the Primary Zone on Cache Slough.

The one public park in the Delta area is Sandy Beach Park in Rio Vista on the Sacramento River. This park has 42 campsites, a fishing pier, a scenic trail, picnicking sites, and a launch ramp. The Park is outside the Legal Delta, adjacent to the waters of the Primary Zone.

Two "other" facilities exist in Solano County. One is the Jepson Prairie Preserve, which was recently transferred from Nature Conservancy to the Solano County Farmlands and Open Space Foundation. The Preserve has a trail through its 1,566 acres of vernal pools and grasslands. The other facility is the non-profit Western Railway Museum located at the Rio Vista Junction. This facility offers rail excursions through the Jepson Prairie in wildflower season. The facility also has a museum and picnicking facilities.

The Hastings Island Hunting preserve is a private upland game bird hunting facility occupying most of Hastings Tract, covering approximately 4,700 acres.

#### **Yolo County**

Yolo County lies in the northernmost portion of the Delta and makes up about 15 percent of the Primary Zone, approximately 75,000 acres. The County lands are bisected by the Sacramento Deep Water Ship Channel, which connects the Sacramento River near Rio Vista to the Port of Sacramento in West Sacramento. The lands west of the ship channel make up much of the Yolo Bypass, a federal floodway. The lands east of the ship channel include: Merritt Island, Little Holland Tract, and Liberty Island. The waterways in the County include Elk Slough, the Sacramento Deep Water Ship Channel, the Sacramento River, and Winchester Lake. The major city outside of the Primary Zone in Yolo County is West Sacramento. The only community in the Primary Zone is Clarksburg.

There are five marinas in Yolo County, three are "medium" marinas, containing 50 to 200 berths, and two are "small" marinas, with less than 50 berths. All of these marinas are privately owned. The three "medium" marinas are located in the Secondary Zone of the Delta and include: the Four Seasons Marina, Sherwood Harbor, and the Sacramento Yacht Club, all in West Sacramento on the Sacramento River. The two small marinas located in the Primary Zone of the Delta are: Clarksburg Marina and StanÆs Yolo Marina, both located in Clarksburg on the Sacramento River.

There are five launch facilities in Yolo County. Three of the ramps are privately owned by marinas or clubs. Two launch ramps are publicly owned and operated: Clarksburg Public Fishing Access on Merritt Island on the Sacramento River, and Broderick Boat Ramp in West Sacramento on the Sacramento River.

One facility provides camping sites: the Sherwood Harbor Marina in West Sacramento on the Sacramento River. This facility has 39 camping sites, 85 berths, and areas designated for picnicking.

Fishing access is provided at Clarksburg Public Fishing Access on Merritt Island on the Sacramento River.

At the Port of Sacramento there is a private sailing club and a private rowing club. These sites are in the Secondary Zone.

The 3,500 acre Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area just South of I-5 is jointly managed by Department of Fish and Game and Yolo Basin Foundation. A driving tour and trails are open for wildlife viewing. Public hunting is allowed in some areas.

There are a large number of private duck clubs in Yolo County, all located in the Yolo Bypass. The clubs vary greatly in size ranging from 30 acres to 3,244 acres.

One other facility in Yolo County is the Yolo Short Line Railroad which connects Woodland to Clarksburg, and features excursion trips to and through the Primary and Secondary Zones of the Delta.

#### **Sacramento County**

Sacramento County is located in the northeastern and western area of the Delta, from I-5 southwest to the confluence of the Sacramento and San Joaquin Rivers, covering about 95,000 acres, approximately 19 percent of the Primary Zone. Additional County lands are in the Secondary Zone and outside the Legal Delta and provide access to the Delta waters. Islands and tracts in the Primary Zone include: Pierson District, Sutter Island, Grand Island, McCormack Williamson Tract, Dead Horse Island, Tyler Island, Brannan-Andrus Island, Twitchell Island, and Sherman Island. Much of Brannan-Andrus Island north of Highway 12 is in the Secondary Zone. The State of California owns much of the land in the southernmost part of the County, including large portions of Sherman and Twitchell Islands, and

Brannan Island State Recreation Area. Delta water areas include Georgiana Slough, the North Fork of the Mokelumne River, the Sacramento Deep Water Channel, the Sacramento River, the San Joaquin River, and Sevenmile Slough. Cities and communities within the Primary Zone include: Courtland, Hood, Locke, Walnut Grove, and Ryde. The City of Isleton is located in the Secondary Zone.

Sacramento County is home to a variety of public and privately owned small, medium and large sized marinas. "Small" marinas contain 50 or fewer berths. There are 14 small marinas, all are privately owned, with a berth range of six to 47. Most are located in the Primary Zone of the Delta and grouped around Andrus Island, the City of Sacramento, and the Walnut Grove area.

Fourteen "medium" marinas exist in the County; all are privately owned. Medium marinas have between 50 and 200 berths. Those within Sacramento County are from 54 to 180 berths. These medium sized marinas are primarily found in the areas surrounding the City of Sacramento, Andrus Island, Sherman Island, Brannan Island, and Walnut Grove; most of these are located within the Primary Zone of the Delta. One is located outside the Legal Delta, in the City of Sacramento, with access to the waters of the Primary Zone.

Seven "large" marinas are located in Sacramento County, each containing over 200 berths. All of these marinas are privately owned, except for the Sacramento Marina in the City of Sacramento, on the Sacramento River. The Sacramento Marina is one of the largest with 553 berths, a launch ramp, and a trail. Most of the "large" marinas are grouped on Andrus Island within the Primary Zone of the Delta.

There are a large number of launch ramps throughout Sacramento County, most of which are located in the Primary Zone, with a few in the Secondary Zone and outside of the Legal Delta. The ramps are clustered in the City of Sacramento, Andrus Island, Brannan Island, and Sherman Island. Many of the ramps are in privately owned marinas. Some of the ramps are located at public launch facilities, which also often include picnic sites, public trails, fishing access, and sometimes beach access and windsurfing sites. A very large facility is located at Brannan Island State Recreation Area on Brannan Island on the Sacramento River. Brannan Island State Recreation Area also has 32 berths, 102 camping sites, picnic facilities, fishing access, public trail, and beach access.

Tent and RV camping sites are located in Sacramento County. Most of the camping sites are located in privately owned marinas. These camping sites are primarily on the Brannan Island, Andrus Island, and in the City of Sacramento. Brannan Island State Recreation Area has extensive camping facilities, as well as a launch ramp. Several private marinas and resorts provide campsites. Delta Isle, on Andrus Island, has the largest number of camping sites--212. This resort also includes 35 berths, picnic sites, and a fishing pier.

There are a large number of picnic areas provided throughout Sacramento County in both public and private facilities. All of the publicly owned launch ramp and fishing access sites also provide picnicking sites.

Formal fishing access is located at a few private marinas, and is generally provided at the publicly owned launch ramps and parks. The County provides fishing access at several sites along the Sacramento River including the Cliffhouse Fishing Access and Georgiana Slough Access.

Trails in the Primary Zone are limited in number. Brannan Island State Recreation Area has numerous trails, and the Department of Parks and Recreation has converted the old railroad right-of-way behind Locke to a gravel trail. There are trails at several facilities in the Secondary Zone, such as Cosumnes Preserve and Stone Lakes Wildlife Refuge trails, which allow wildlife observation. Additional trails are located in the City of Sacramento including: Discovery Park; Garcia Bend Park; and Miller Park. The City has recently adopted a master plan to expand levee-top trails along the Sacramento and American Rivers.

Four private Yacht Clubs are located in Sacramento County: two on the San Joaquin River, one on the Mokelumne, and one on Georgiana Slough. Three are located within the Primary Zone of the Delta and one in the Secondary Zone.

The only State parks in the Delta are located in Sacramento County: Brannan Island State Recreation Area and Delta Meadows River Park, near Locke. There is also a private/public preserve, Cosumnes River Preserve, on the Cosumnes River and a federal wildlife refuge, Stone Lakes Wildlife Refuge, at Stone Lakes. The Refuges include lands owned by Sacramento County, the State, and Fish and Wildlife Service. All of these areas, except for parts of the Cosumnes River Preserve, are located within the Primary Zone of the Delta and have trails, although the Refuge trails are open on a limited basis. The Cosumnes Preserve has an on-site visitor facility.

Sherman Island Waterfowl Management Area at the southern end of Sherman Island is managed for public hunting and fishing from boats; there are no land facilities. This area is owned and managed by Department of Fish and Game, and is located in the Primary Zone.

The Sacramento River, from Rio Vista to the tip of Sherman Island, provides unique opportunities for windsurfing. Formal and informal facilities support wind-surfing providing sales and rental of equipment, physical access to the water, and camping sites for windsurfers. The windsurfer support sites in Sacramento County are located on Brannan and Sherman Islands in the Primary Zone.

All but one of the registered historic sites in the Primary Zone are located within Sacramento County. Walnut Grove sites include: Imperial Theater, Gauken Hall, the Walnut Grove Japanese-American Historic District, the Walnut Grove Chinese-American Historic District, the Walnut Grove Commercial/Residential Historic District, and Jean Harvie School. Others historic sites in the County include: Rosebud Ranch near Hood, Chinese and Japanese Commercial Districts in Isleton, Delta Meadows (archeological site) near Locke, the Town of Locke, and the River Mansion on Grand Island (see map of Historic Sites).

#### **Contra Costa County**

Contra Costa County is located in the southwestern portion of the Primary Zone and covers approximately 47,000 acres, about ten percent of the Primary Zone. Portions of the County are located within the Secondary Zone of the Delta and provide access to Primary Zone waters. Islands and tracts within the Primary Zone include: Browns Island (within the City of Pittsburg), Winter Island, Jersey Island, Bradford Island, Webb Tract, Holland Tract, Palm Tract, Orwood Tract, Knightsen area, and Coney Island. The areas in the Secondary Zone include: Bethel Island, Hotchkiss Tract, and Veale Tract. Water areas include: Big Break, partially owned by East Bay Regional Park District.

Most of Jersey Island has been purchased by Ironhouse Sanitary District and is proposed to be used for disposal of treated wastewater and biosolids. A pending private project would use Webb Tract as a reservoir and much of Holland Tract as managed wetland and recreation (Delta Wetlands project). Major cities within the Secondary Zone include Antioch, Brentwood, Discovery Bay, Oakley, and Pittsburg. Within the Primary Zone are the Communities of Knightsen and Bethel Island.

Contra Costa County has a large number of marinas, both public and private. Many marinas provide for other recreational activities such as camping, fishing, houseboat rentals, and picnic sites. "Small" marinas contain 50 or fewer berths. There are 19 small marinas within the Delta in Contra Costa County. They are located in the Secondary Zone of the Delta in the Bethel Island and Hotchkiss Tract areas, and range in size from seven to 46 berths. All of these small marinas are privately owned and operated.

"Medium" marinas are those which have between 50 to 200 berths. Twelve medium sized marinas are located in the Secondary Zone of the Delta, again primarily in the Bethel Island area. The number of berths ranges from 52 to 160. All of these marinas are privately owned and operated.

"Large" marinas contain more than 200 berths. There are eight large marinas within the County, located in Pittsburg and Antioch in the Secondary Zone of the Delta. The large marinas range from 203 to 722 berths. Most of these marinas are privately owned. There are two large public marinas: the Antioch Marina with 285 berths and a public trail, fishing pier, and other public amenities; and the Pittsburg Marina with 722 berths and a boat ramp.

There are many launch facilities within Contra Costa County. Almost all of the ramps are located within marinas in the Secondary Zone of the Delta, most in the areas around Bethel Island and Hotchkiss Tract.

Camping sites are also found within the County in the Delta. Camping includes tent and RV camp sites. All of the identified camping sites are privately owned, and located within marinas. The number of camping sites range from about 2 to 500 sites per facility. Orwood Resort on Orwood Tract on the Old River has the largest number of camping sites, 500. The Resort also provides launch ramp, picnic area, and fishing access.

A limited number of picnic areas are provided at private marinas: there are a couple on Bethel Island, a couple on Orwood Tract, and a few in Antioch. Publicly owned picnic areas are provided at: Antioch Muni Boat Ramp in Antioch on the San Joaquin River; Antioch Regional Shoreline in Antioch on the Sacramento River; Riverview Park in Pittsburg on the Sacramento River; and Barbara Price Marina Park in Antioch on the Sacramento River.

Formal fishing access is provided at a few marinas and at several sites created specifically for fishing. The marinas which provide fishing access are privately owned. Public fishing sites include: Antioch Regional Shoreline in Antioch on the Sacramento River; Clifton Court Forebay in Italian Slough; FrankÆs Tract State Recreation Area (from boats only); Riverview Park in Pittsburg on the Sacramento River; and Riverview Lodge Pier in Pittsburg on the Sacramento River. Most of these fishing access sites are located in the Antioch and Pittsburg areas.

Trail sites in Contra Costa County include the Antioch Riverfront Promenade, Antioch Marina in Antioch along the San Joaquin River, and Marsh Creek Trail between Oakley and Brentwood along Marsh Creek--a five and a half mile long trail.

Eight private Yacht Clubs are located within the Delta area of Contra Costa County. They are located within the Secondary Zone of the Delta, primarily in Antioch and around Bethel Island.

Two public parks are located on the Delta waterfront. One is East Bay Regional Park DistrictÆs Antioch Regional Shoreline in Antioch on the Sacramento River in the Secondary Zone, which includes facilities for picnicking and fishing. Another is the Barbara Price Marina Park in Antioch on the Sacramento River, also in the Secondary Zone, which contains picnic facilities and a public walkway. East Bay Regional Park District owns Browns Island and the western half of Big Break; neither site has any recreational facilities.

Franks Tract State Recreation Area and Big Break allow public hunting access during waterfowl hunting season. Franks Tract is located in the Primary Zone of the Delta and also allows fishing as well; hunting is allowed from permitted floating blinds and from boats. Big Break, near Oakley has been used for waterfowl hunting for many years; EBRPD will allow hunting to continue from floating blinds or boats.

# San Joaquin County

San Joaquin CountyÆs Primary Zone lands are located in the southern and western sections of the Legal Delta covering about 190,000 acres, approximately 39 percent of the Primary Zone. The lands include the areas generally bound by I-5 to the east, Old River to the south, Old River and the Mokelumne River to the west and the Mokelumne River to the north. Waterways in the Primary Zone include: Bear Creek, the Calaveras River, the Stockton Deep Water Channel, the Middle River, the North and South Forks of the Mokelumne River, Old River, and the San Joaquin River. Islands and tracts in the Primary Zone include: New Hope Tract, Canal Ranch, Brack Tract, Terminous Tract, Staten Island, Bouldin Island,

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Venice Island, Empire Tract, King Island, Mandeville Island, Medford Island, Rindge Tract, McDonald, Bacon Island, Lower and Upper Jones Tract, Lower, Middle, and Upper Roberts Islands, Union Island, Fabian Tract, Woodward Tract, and Victoria Island. Much of the City of Stockton is located in the Secondary Zone, with some City lands on Roberts Island in the Primary Zone.

Numerous marinas are located within the County boundaries; all of these marinas are privately owned and operated. "Small" marinas contain 50 or fewer berths. There are six small marinas which range from ten to 43 berths. Four of these marinas are located in the Primary Zone of the Delta; two are located within the Secondary Zone. These marinas are scattered throughout the Delta: one on the Middle River, two on the San Joaquin River, two on the South Fork of the Mokelumne River, and one on the Deep Water Channel.

"Medium" marinas contain between 50 to 200 berths. Eight medium marinas are located in the Primary and Secondary Zones of the Delta. Several are on the banks of the San Joaquin River and the Deep Water Channel; others are on Little Potato Slough, Disappointment Slough, Fabian and Bell Canals, Turner Cut, and Whiskey Slough. Houseboat rentals are available at Herman and Helen's and Holiday Harbor Marina.

"Large" marinas contain more than 200 berths. Five large marinas are located in the Primary and the Secondary Zones. These large marinas range from 201 to 700 berths. Three of these marinas are located in the Primary Zone of the Delta bordering Honker Cut and Disappointment Slough, Potato Slough, and Turner Cut. The largest marina, Village West, with 700 berths, is located on Fourteen Mile Slough in the City of Stockton. Three of the large marinas provide houseboat rentals: King Island Resort, Paradise Point Marina, and Tower Park Marina. All of the large marinas include picnic facilities and a boat launch ramp.

There are numerous launching facilities within San Joaquin County. Most of the marinas have launch ramps. Public boat launch facilities include: Morelli Park in Stockton on the Deep Water Channel; Buckley Cove Park in Stockton on the Deep Water Channel; Dos Reis Park in the Lathrop Area on the San Joaquin River; Louis Park in Stockton on the Smith Canal; and Mossdale Crossing in Lathrop on the San Joaquin River. Many of these publicly owned sites include other recreational facilities for picnicking, fishing, camping, and hiking.

Tent and RV camping sites are located throughout the Delta area of San Joaquin County. Most of the camping areas are privately owned and located in marinas; however, there are several publicly owned sites, including Dos Reis Park in the Lathrop Area on the San Joaquin River with 26 camping sites, launch ramps, picnicking sites and fishing access; and Westgate Landing on Terminous Island by the Mokelumne River which has 14 camping sites, 30 berths, picnicking areas, and a fishing pier. The largest camping area is in Tower Park on Terminous Island on Little Potato Slough with 400 camping sites, 390 berths, a launch ramp, and picnicking sites.

There are quite a number of picnic areas located within the San Joaquin County portion of the Delta in privately owned marinas and in publicly owned parks. Public picnicking areas are located at American Legion Park in Stockton, Buckley Cove Park in Stockton on the Deep Water Channel, Dos Reis Park in the Lathrop Area on the San Joaquin River, Mossdale Crossing in Lathrop on the San Joaquin River, and at Westgate Landing on Terminous Island on the Mokelumne River. Marinas which offer picnic facilities to berthers include: King Island Resort, Mossdale Marina, New Hope Landing, Paradise Point Marina, Stephens Anchorage, Tiki Lagun, Tower Park, and Windmill Cove.

Formal fishing access is located at six locations in San Joaquin County. Most formal fishing access is located in publicly owned parks or wildlife areas in the Secondary Zone of the Delta. White Slough Wildlife Area on Terminous and Shin Kee Tracts is a 272 acre wildlife area managed by the Department of Fish and Game which allows fishing access, hunting, and hiking. Other formal fishing access areas are in American Legion Park, Buckley Cove Park, Dos Reis Park, Fritz Grupe Park, and Westgate Landing.

There are four trails in San Joaquin County near the Delta waterways these include: the Bike and Jog

Path in Stockton on the Calaveras River, Louis Park in Stockton on the Smith Canal, Van Buskirk Park in Stockton on Walker Slough, and White Slough Wildlife Area on Terminous and Shin Kee Tracts. All of these trails are publicly owned and managed.

Eleven private Yacht Clubs were inventoried in San Joaquin County. Many are located on the banks of the Stockton Deep Water Channel.

Nine Public Parks are located on the waterfront of San Joaquin County. The City of Stockton sites include: American Legion Park, Buckley Cove Park, Fritz Grupe Park, Louis Park, McLeod Park, and Van Buskirk Park. Other County-owned public parks include: Dos Reis Park, Mossdale Crossing Park, and Westgate Landing. Westgate Landing is located in the Primary Zone. These parks provide fishing access, camping facilities, picnicking facilities, trails, and launch ramps.

Two special wildlife facilities are founded in San Joaquin County. One of these facilities is White Slough Wildlife Area on Terminous and Shin Kee Tracts. This area owned by the State Department of Fish and Game, allows fishing access, and hunting. The other facility is the Woodbridge Preserve on Brack Tract by Hog Slough, owned and managed by the State Department of Fish and Game as seasonal Sandhill Crane habitat. The Department allows wildlife viewing with docent supervision.

#### DESCRIPTION OF RECREATIONAL FACILITIES BY TYPE

This section of the inventory describes the recreational facilities in the Primary Zone, in the Secondary Zone, and directly adjacent to the Legal Delta by type. The same data collection methodology used to prepare the geographic description of recreation facilities (county by county) was used for this section (see attached list of sources). The written descriptions are followed by charts and by maps which illustrate the location of the recreation facilities deltawide. In the charts, the facilities are grouped by County. The types of facilities are listed in alphabetical order.

#### **Boat Launch Facilities**

Boat launch facilities are an amenity found in almost every public and private marina in the Delta area. Most marinas provide at least one launch ramp (a concrete "driveway" into the water where a boat on a trailer is backed into the water, then allowed to float off). Most launch ramps also provide a dock to secure boats after they are launched. Some other marinas provide a launch sling from a crane-type structure, or a hoist on a truck. These facilities are sometimes provided if there is inadequate space for a launch ramp, or if there is a large storage facility on site and using a truck eases launching of boats stored on site.

In addition to boat launch facilities in public and private marinas, there are a number of publicly owned boat launching facilities. These launch facilities are often used by day users, such as water-skiers, to launch personal watercraft, or by fishermen. Fishermen particularly like to have access to launch facilities early in the morning.

Boat launch facilities include: Sandy Beach Regional Park, Rio Vista Fishing Access, Broderick Boat Ramp, Clarksburg Public Fishing Access, Brannan Island State Recreation Area, Discovery Park, Hogback Island Recreation Area, Miller Park, Sherman Island Fishing Access, Tiscornia Park, Antioch Municipal Boat Ramp, Clifton County Forebay (during hunting season only), Buckley Cove Park, Dos

Reis Park, Louis Park, Morelli Boat Ramp Park, and Mossdale Crossing Park. There is often a fee charged for use of these public launch ramps.

Of these public boat launch facilities, five are in the Primary Zone, six are in the Secondary Zone, and six are out of the Legal Delta.

# **Camping and Picnic Sites**

Camping sites are located throughout the Delta, often in association with larger park or resort facilities. Some smaller facilities offer a limited number of camping sites. Forty-three facilities offer camping. Many of the larger marinas in the Delta area provide a

"suite" of recreational facilities to provide for a variety of recreational activities during a vacation or visit. For example, a marina will often provide berths, a launch facility, camping sites, picnic and barbecue facilities, fishing access and water access.

Examples of this type of multi-use facility include Delta Marina, Sandy Beach Regional Park, Snug Harbor, Sherwood Harbor Resort, B & W Resort, Brannan Island State Park, BrunoÆs Island Yacht Harbor, Delta Bay Club, Delta Isle, Duck Island RV Park, EddoÆs Harbor and RV Park, Freeport Marina, Happy Harbor, KoKet Resort, Lighthouse Resort, MartinÆs Sherman Lake Marina, Outrigger Marina, Owl Harbor, Rancho Marina, VieiraÆs Resort, Meaders Resort, Bethel Harbor, Delta Resort, FrankÆs Marina, RussoÆs Marina, Orwood Resort, Dos Reis Park, Tiki Lagun, Tower Park Marina, Tracy Oasis Marina, Turner Cut Resort, Westgate Landing Park, Whiskey Slough Harbor, and Windmill Cove Marina and RV Park. Most of the larger marinas and resorts that provide camping are located in the Primary Zone of the Delta. Facilities at private marinas are available to tenants and their guests, not the general public. In addition, some of the resorts are managed as private clubs, with use by members only. It should be noted there are very few other options for overnight lodging in the Primary Zone. Some of the larger public marinas have facilities available to the general public, such as trails and picnic areas.

As noted above, picnic facilities are often provided as part of a "suite" of improvements at a larger facilities inviting several days stay. Of these sites, 24 are located in the Primary Zone and nine are in the Secondary Zone.

In addition, 21 public day use facilities provide picnic tables as part of a suite of improvements aimed at boaters and fishermen. Most of the sites are public, or managed by a non-profit group and are available free or with a modest day use fee.

Picnic sites are located at: Western Railway Museum, Rio Vista Public Fishing Access, Rio Vista Riverbank Fishing Access, Cliffhouse Fishing Access, Cosumnes River Preserve, Discovery Park, Garcia Bend Park, Georgiana Slough Fishing Access, Hogback Island Recreation Area, Miller Park, Sherman Island Fishing Access, Windy Cove, Tiscornia Park, Barbara Price Marina Park, Antioch Muni Boat Ramp, Antioch Regional Shoreline, Riverview Park, American Legion Park, Buckley Cove Park, Dos Reis Park, and Mossdale Crossing Park.

Five day use sites with picnic facilities are located in the Primary Zone, ten in the Secondary Zone, and six outside the Legal Delta. Many of the facilities are in Sacramento and Stockton, areas with large populations that seek access to the waters of the Delta.

#### **Fishing Access**

Formal fishing access on the shoreline is provided at a number of locations in the Primary Zone, the Secondary Zone and adjacent to the Legal Delta. In addition, many fishermen fish from their boats and many people fish from the banks of the levees, adjacent to public roadways. The informal parking sites are not included in this inventory.

Fishing is provided in a number of the larger marinas, again as part of a suite of improvements for

recreational users. In addition, many public day use facilities emphasize fishing access and facilities. The day use facilities with fishing access include: Sandy Beach Regional Park, Rio Vista Public Fishing Access, Rio Vista Riverbank Fishing Access, Clarksburg Public Fishing Access, Brannan Island State Recreation Area, Cliffhouse Fishing Access, Delta Meadows River Park, Discovery Park, Garcia Bend Park, Georgiana Slough Fishing Access, Hogback Island Recreation Area, Miller Park, Sherman Island Fishing Access, Tiscornia Park, Antioch Marina, Antioch Municipal Boat Ramp, Antioch Regional Shoreline, Riverview Lodge Pier, Riverview Park, Clifton Court Forebay, Buckley Cove Park, Dos Reis Park, Fritz Grupe Park, Louis Park, Westgate Landing Park, and White Slough State Wildlife Area.

There are also several water-covered areas owned and managed by public agencies which are available for fishing from boats only. These include: Big Break and Browns Island, Franks Tract, and Sherman Island Waterfowl Management Area.

The distribution of fishing access sites includes 22 sites in the Primary Zone; 12 in the Secondary Zone; and six outside the Legal Delta.

# Historic Sites in the Primary Zone of the Delta

A number of sites in the Primary Zone on the National Federal Register or listed as a California Registered Historical Landmark are described; sites in the Secondary Zone are **not** included in the inventory.

Most of the Historic Sites are located in **Sacramento County**. Near Hood is the Rosebud Ranch, with a privately owned historic home. The entire Town of Locke is designated; Locke is the only rural Chinese community in the United States. The community is in private ownership; there are no plans for renovation. Locke is a well-known visitor destination and includes an old schoolhouse, a small museum, restaurants, art galleries, and shops. Near Locke, Delta Meadows, has been listed recognizing the remnants of a Miwok village on one of the offshore islands. Within Walnut Grove, three neighborhoods on the east side of the River are designated: Japanese-American Historic District, the Chinese American Historic District, and the Commercial/Residential Historic District. In addition, the Gauken Hall and the Imperial Theater have been listed individually. These areas are in private ownership. In Isleton, the Chinese and Japanese Commercial Districts are designated; these areas are privately owned.

Two sites in the Primary Zone are listed as California Points of Historical Interest. On Grand Island, the River Mansion is privately-owned but is available for rental for special

events, serves Sunday brunch, and now has a limited number of rooms available for overnight stays. In Walnut Grove the Jean Harvie School is now a community center, owned and operated by Sacramento County.

The Western Railway Museum, is outside the Legal Delta in **Solano County**, but provides a starting point for excursion rail trips that travel into the Primary Zone. The Museum is a designated historic site.

#### Hunting

Hunting is an activity which has long been associated with agricultural lands in the Primary Zone. Seasonal hunting on privately owned agricultural lands continues without any formal improvements or approvals. Hunting on private lands is allowed only with the permission of the landowner.

In addition to informal hunting, there are many hunting clubs in the Primary Zone. Most of the clubs are duck clubs, although there are some clubs which specialize in upland game bird hunting. The listing of duck clubs and hunting clubs is incomplete; records are limited. Hunting and duck clubs are open to members and their guests only. There are 17 duck clubs in the Yolo Bypass area of **Yolo County** in the Primary Zone. The inventory lists a few additional duck clubs in other areas of the Primary Zone.

The only land areas in the Primary Zone available for public hunting are the White Slough State Wildlife Area and portions of the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area. Publicly-owned water-covered areas available for

public hunting include: Sherman Island Waterfowl Management Area; Franks Tract; and parts of Big Break.

#### Marinas

Marinas are found throughout the Delta, in the Primary Zone, the Secondary Zone, and outside the Legal Delta adjacent to the waters of the Primary Zone. Marinas in the Delta area range in size from six berths to 700 berths. They vary widely in age, in level of maintenance, and in type and number of amenities and improvements. For discussion purposes, in this inventory the marinas are grouped by size: Small Marinas are less than 50 berths, Medium Marinas with between 50 and 200 berths, and Large Marinas, with over 200 berths. Note there are a lot of inconsistencies in various sources regarding the number of berths in Delta marinas. Every attempt has been made to use the most recently available information regarding the number of berths.

The total number of marinas in the inventory is 106--48 in the Primary Zone, 53 in the Secondary Zone, and six outside the Legal Delta. The marinas have a total of 12,189 berths--4,617 in the Primary Zone, 6,432 in the Secondary Zone, and 1,140 outside the Legal Delta.

#### **Small Marinas: Under 50 Berths**

The inventory includes 43 small marinas; 20 in the Primary Zone, 21 in the Secondary Zone and two outside the Legal Delta. Also included in the Small Marina inventory are Brannan Island State Recreation Area in Sacramento County and San Joaquin CountyÆs Westgate Landing Park. These two facilities do not conform to the usual description of "marinas" because the berths are not rented long term, however, the slips are available for short-term rental to park visitors.

The largest number of small marinas are located in **Contra Costa County**, in the Bethel Island/Hotchkiss Tract area in the Secondary Zone of the Delta. Many of these very small marinas are old and have limited access, parking, and amenities, although some have been upgraded and modernized. The small marinas in this area range in size from seven berths of 46 berths. One small marina is located in the Primary Zone; the Lazy M Marina near Clifton Court Forebay.

There are 14 small marinas in or adjacent to the Primary Zone of the Delta in **Sacramento County**. Twelve are located in the Primary Zone. Two are outside the Legal Delta and provide access to the Delta waterways. Half of the small marinas are located on Andrus Island and range in size from 18 to 47 berths. Two small marinas are located on Brannan Island and two in Walnut Grove. One small marina is located on Sutter Island.

Eight small marinas are located in **San Joaquin County**, six in the Primary Zone and two in the Secondary Zone. The small marinas have a wide distribution throughout San Joaquin County. The small marinas range in size from ten berths to 43 berths.

Two small marinas are located in **Yolo County**. The Clarksburg Marina with five berths is in the Primary Zone. StanÆs Yolo Marina, with 20 berths, is located in West Sacramento in the Secondary Zone.

There are a total of 948 berths in the 43 small marinas in the inventory: 504 in the Primary Zone; 405 in the Secondary Zone; and 39 outside the Legal Delta.

# Medium Marinas: Between 50 and 200 Berths

The inventory includes 42 medium sized marinas; 19 in the Primary Zone; 21 in the Secondary Zone and two outside the Legal Delta. Of the medium sized marinas, all are privately owned.

The largest number of medium sized marinas, 14, are located in **Sacramento County**. Nine are located in the Primary Zone, three are in the Secondary Zone and two are located outside the Legal Delta. One of the marinas is located in Locke, one in Walnut Grove, there are three medium marinas on Sherman

Island, and there are four on Andrus Island. The medium marinas in Sacramento County range in size from 59 to 180 berths.

There are 13 medium marinas in **Contra Costa County**; three are in the Primary Zone, and ten are in the Secondary Zone. Seven of the marinas are in the Bethel Island/Hotchkiss Tract area of the Secondary Zone, with three located in Antioch. The marinas in the Primary Zone are located on Orwood Tract, Veale Tract, and Holland Tract. The marinas range in size from 52 to 160 berths.

There are nine medium sized marinas in **San Joaquin County**. Five are located in the Primary Zone and four are located in the Secondary Zone. The marinas in the Primary Zone are located on Empire Tract, King Island, Fabian Tract, Stockton, and two on Roberts Island. The medium sized marinas in the Secondary Zone are all located in Stockton.

Three medium sized marinas are located in **Yolo County**, all in West Sacramento in the Secondary Zone.

Two medium sized marinas are located in **Solano County**. Both are located in the Primary Zone, one on Prospect Island and one on Ryer Island.

There are a total of 4,539 berths in the 42 medium marinas: 2,024 in the Primary Zone; 2,242 in the Secondary Zone; and 273 outside the Legal Delta.

# **Large Marinas: Over 200 Berths**

The inventory includes 21 large marinas; eight in the Primary Zone, 11 in the Secondary Zone, and two outside the Legal Delta. Of the large sized marinas, three are public marinas: Sacramento Marina, Antioch Marina, and Pittsburg Marina. The large marinas are fairly equally distributed between Contra Costa (eight), Sacramento (six), and San Joaquin (six) Counties. One large marina is located in Solano County.

Of the eight marinas in **Contra Costa County**, all but one are located in the Secondary Zone in Antioch, Oakley, Hotchkiss Tract, Bethel Island, and Discovery Bay. The Holland Riverside Marina with 232 berths is located in the Primary Zone on Holland Tract. The large marinas range in size from 203 to 722 berths.

The six large marinas in **Sacramento County** range in size from 160 to 553 berths. Four large marinas are located in the Primary Zone, all on Andrus Island. One large marina is located in the Secondary Zone in Isleton. One large marina, the Sacramento Marina, is located outside the Legal Delta in the City of Sacramento.

There is one large marina in Solano County, the Delta Marina in Rio Vista just outside the Legal Delta.

There are a total of 6,702 berths in the 21 large marinas: 2,089 in the Primary Zone; 3,785 in the Secondary Zone; and 828 outside the Legal Delta.

# **Pump Outs**

Some marinas provide pump-outs to be used to empty holding tanks containing wastewater from larger vessels. Most of the boats used in the Delta are smaller vessels that do not have holding tanks.

In Solano County, pump-outs are located at Delta Marina and Sandy Beach Park.

In Yolo County, pump-outs are located at the Sacramento Yacht Club.

In Sacramento County, pump-outs are located at Boathouse Marina, BrunoÆs Island Yacht Harbor, CliffÆs Marina, DagmarÆs Landing, Delta Bay, KorthÆs Pirate Lair, Metro Marina, Oxbow Marina, PerryÆs Boat Harbor, Rancho Marina, River Bank Marina, Riverview Marina, Sacramento Marina,

Walnut Grove Marina, Brannan Island State Recreation Area, and Ko Ket Resort.

In Contra Costa County, pump-outs are located at Anchor Marina, Antioch Marina, Bethel Island Marina, Discovery Bay Yacht Harbor, Holland Riverside Marina, Lauritzen Yacht Harbor, and MazikeenÆs Landing.

In San Joaquin County, pump-outs are located at Herman & Helen's, Holiday Harbor, King Island Resort, New Hope Landing, Paradise Point Marina, Tiki Lagun, Tower Park, Village West Marina, Waterfront Yacht Harbor, and Whiskey Slough Harbor.

#### **Trails and Paths**

There are trails and paths in the Delta, however, most of the trails and paths are in the Secondary Zone. The trails are either within a park or wildlife area, or along a shoreline in an urban area in the Secondary Zone, or out of the Legal Delta. All the trails and paths described here are public facilities, although some private marinas have trails within their property.

In Yolo County, a wildlife observation trail is included in the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area.

In **Solano County**, the public fishing and access sites in the City of Rio Vista include shoreline trails/paths. In addition, within the Jepson Prairie Preserve, there is a self-guided, loop wildlife observation trail.

In Sacramento County, the parks and recreational areas include trails and paths. In addition, the City of Sacramento has recently approved a master plan which will eventually result in continuous trail/path access along much of the Sacramento River and the American River. There are trails within Brannan Island State Recreation Area. The Delta Meadows River Park has a trail along the old railroad right of way. The Cosumnes Preserve has nature observation trails. Those trails are available, free, at any time.

In Contra Costa County, the Antioch Marina, the Barbara Price Marina Park and the Riverfront Promenade provide shoreline paths. The Pittsburg Marina also includes a waterfront path. In addition, East Bay Regional Park District (EBRPD) has constructed Marsh Creek Trail which links the Contra Costa County northern shoreline to southern areas of the County and a small trail near the eastern edge of Big Break. EBRPD has plans to construct trails throughout the County linking to other regional trails.

The White Slough Wildlife Area in **San Joaquin County** has a trail for hiking and to provide fishing and hunting access. In the Secondary Zone, the City of Stockton has constructed a number of parks adjacent to levees along the Deep Water Channel and other waterways. These parks include paths atop the levees to provide views and access for fishing. The City has also constructed a bike and jog path along the Calaveras River.

# Windsurfing Access Sites

The Sacramento River between Rio Vista and the tip of Sherman Island is well known as a windsurfing area. Windsurfing is a seasonal sport, when the weather is warm and the winds blow. The inventory identifies nine windsurf access sites in **Sacramento County** and one in **Solano County**. Many of these sites are informal access areas, known to the windsurfers, but without improvements or support facilities. Windsurfers also access the water from Sandy Beach Regional Park, Cliffhouse Fishing Access, Delta Windsurf Company, Windy Cove at Brannan Island State Recreation Area, and the Sherman Island Fishing Access. In addition, like fishermen, many windsurfers park alongside the public roads, particularly Highway 160 and Sherman Island Road, to gain access to the Sacramento River waters.

Subj: Leading of the Antioch Dive Bombing Target - Comments and Recommendations

(a) BUDOCKS 1tr B-411.28/jpg MD12/W1-1/L5-7-AE dtd 29 Dec 1953

- 1. Reference (a) requested comments and recommendations concerning the proposed leasing of the Frank's Tract Area east of Antioch. California for use as a dive bombing target.
- 2. The Antioch Target Area (designated target BATER 6) was used continuously by the Nevy from 1943 until expiration of the Navy lease October 27, 1952. Regotiation for renoval of the lease was unsuccessful and the target was closed in October 1952. Continuing action for renewal has been in progress.
- The Sureau is edviced of the scute need for bombing targets within the proximity of the Haval Air Stations in the San Francisco Bay area. The large influx of population in May Area counties combined with the established numerous new civil airways in the region has necessitated the abandonment of mest of the World Mar II targets. There are presently only two mir-to-ground bombing targets (Target BATER 3 and Target BAKER 4, West of ALF Crows Landing) available from NAS Alameda, BAS Koffett Field, and BAS Oakland,
- 4. In spite of the Bavy's vital need for this additional target, however, it has become apparent that there are other important aspects to be considered. In recent weeks the Commandant has been edvised of the interest of sportemen and recreational groups in Frank's Tract. Further, the State Park Commission is seriously considering the establishment of a State Aquatic Park in this area. Vithin the past two weeks, the Consendant has received numerous letters from

COPY TO SCOTISMONS ASSOCIATIONS and their representatives protesting the acquisition.

5. It is now apparent that pursuance of this acquisition by the Department of the Navy would meet with solid opposition from these influential groups. It is considered that the resultant adverse public relations would be most detrimental to the Navy and should be evolded.

6. In view of the foregoing, the request for the terget is withdrawn and all Neval District interest in Frank's Tract is terminated.

- 2. By separate correspondence the Bureau of Aeronautics has recommended to the Chief of Naval Operations that former Naval Auxiliary Air Station, Arcata, California be declared excess to the needs of the Navy and disposed of as surplus property. Lease NJy(R)-40423 covering a portion of the station should be kept in force until final action on disposal of the property has been taken.
- 3. The Bureau of Aeronautics has on record two leases which were not included in enclosure (1). These are NOy(R)-44596 which allows the Government to erect 10 poles on Vernon Holthouse land adjacent to Naval Air Station, Moffett Field and NOy(R)-45263 covering land used for a bombing target located in Sonoma County California. It is requested that the Bureau of Yards and Docks ascertain from the Commandant, Twelfth Naval District whether there exists a continuing need for these leases. If in the affirmative, it is further requested that the Bureau of Yards and Docks take the necessary action to renew them for fiscal year 1954.
- 4. Reference (a) indicated that lease NÖy(R)-45197 covering space occupied by Shore Patrol at Oakland, California, should be transferred to the cognizance of the Bureau of Aeronautics. Since no official request has been received to effect the transfer of this lease, the Bureau of Aeronautics has taken no affirmative action in that regard. Advise is, therefore, requested as to whether or not this bureau should assume responsibility for this lease.

5. It is noted from reference (b) that two leases under the Bureau of Aeronautics' cognizance, namely NOy(R)-46802 and 46801, have not been recommended for renewal by the Commandant, Twelfth Naval District. These two leases apparently cover lands within the Chocolate Mountain Gunnery Range. Since this activity is situated in the Eleventh Naval District, it is probable that recommendations for their renewal will be submitted in due time by the Commandant Eleventh Naval District.

- 1. By reference (a), the District Public Works Officer, Twelfth Naval District, advised of unsatisfactory results in re-negotiation of Lease NOy(R)-35540. The Board of Directors, California Peat Company, Incorporated, Lessor, have stated that a new lease would be entered into only under the following conditions:
  - a. Lease term of one year.
  - b. Rental of \$2,500.00 per year.
  - c. The Lessor to be allowed to continue their peat digging operations.
- d. Sportsmen to be allowed to fish in the subject area with fees collected by the lessor.
- 2. The following comments are offered regarding the conditions outlined above:
- a. It is highly desirable that a lease for this target area be entered into for a term exceeding one year, preferably five to ten years. While a majority of the gunnery training is conducted at Auxiliary Landing Field, Fallon, target sites are required in the vicinity of San Francisco Bay Area for use by carrier aircraft squadrons, patrol squadrons, and anti-submarine squadrons stationed at Maval Air Station, Alameda, and Naval Air Station, Moffett Field. This requirement is caused by the need of pilots, undergoing other phases of training prior to deployment to the Far East, to maintain the gunnery proficiency acquired at ALF Fallon. Limited personnel facilities available at ALF Fallon preclude scheduling all squadrons to that activity for gunnery training or refresher training immediately prior to deployment.

- b. The armost rental of \$2500 per year is considered high but not exorbitant. When the proposed rental is considered in light of the value of the target site to the Navy, it is considered acceptable.
- e. Lease MCy(R)-35440 stipulated that the leasor was allowed to dig past in the area. This arrangement has been satisfactory in the past. It is considered that this arrangement will be satisfactory in the fature, provided the Peat Company will savine two weeks in advance of any proposed digging operations in the vicinity of the target so that the target structures can be either noved or closed for the period of the digging operations.
- d. This condition is not acceptable. This command is not prepared to accept the responsibility for fishermen entering the target area on a fee basis with consequent liability of the Mavy in case of injury or death attributable to dive bombing or rocket training. It has been suspected that fishermen have entered the area while the area was under lease to the Mavy. Such entry was in violation of the lease and contrary to warning signs posted in the area so that such entry was considered to be at the risk of the fishermen. The risk is too great for joint use by fishermen and the Mavy.
- 3. Differts to obtain elequate new target areas for the gamery training of pilots in the vicinity of San Francisco Ray Area have been so unproductive that less of this target site will dangerously curtail gamery training facilities with little hope of obtaining a replacement area. The number of airsays converging on the Ray Area, together with the very large volume of air traffic, have practically prohibited the establishment of a target site in the proximity of the Bay Area. Recent loss of three target sites to airways expansion has seriously hampered gamery training in this area. The Antioch target is within the only remaining air space readily available.
- b. There is an urgent requirement for an indefinite period of time for this target site. Equadrons trained in this area are playing a large part in the fighting in Korse. It is considered manietary that adequate training facilities be provided so that the equadrons may be as well trained as possible. Therefore, it is recommended that additional effort be made to regotiate an acceptable lease. In the event that negotiations are unsuccessful, it is further recommended that consideration be given to consernation to obtain the continued use of this target site.

Fully executed and transmitted to lessors.

5. FALLON ABRIAL GUNNERY RANGE (NAAS FALLON)

700.000 acres more or less.

Lease hold interest acquired by condemnation. Area delineated upon map 3.

This area is used for aerial gunnery, strafing, dive bombing, rocket fire, and it is now proposed to use the area for dropping live bombs. Cattle have been excluded from the area, but have drifted on and in some instances the owners have made no attempt to prevent them from straying upon the range.

The general course of aerial gumnery runs is delineated upon the map in a broken red line. The planes enter from the south part of the west range and fly in the direction indicated by the arrows. There is a short course from east to west on the north part of the east range. The location and extent of the run is not known. It is shown upon the map with short dashes and a question mark.

## Fallon Aerial Gunnery Range (Cont'd)

Strafing practice is conducted until guns are empty from the end of the run as indicated in red on the East range to the end of the range.

Dive bombing and rocket targets within the area are shown upon said map.

# 6. FALLON AERIAL CURRERY RANGE (PROPOSED EXTENSION) (NAAS FALLON)

It is desired to add Dixie Valley and Fairviow Valley down to within a short distance of Highway 50 to the Fallon Aerial Gunnery Range. This addition is delineated upon Map 1.

Request for this area was processed by N.A.B. and forwarded by Com. 12 and is now held in BuAer pending comments of Com. 12 as a result of pending investigation concerning values and mining operations in the area proposed to be acquired. The Swicoffer Mine is located somewhere within the blue shaded area on said map. This mine supposedly produces strategic materials and the owner enlisted the mid of Senator McCarran when he thought the mine was included in the gunnery range as now constituted. Full force opposition is expected if this mine is to be acquired.

The same area northwesterly of the Stillwater Hountain Range and excluded from the present area is considered to be an area which the grazing service much desires to have excluded. There are other mines in the area which are believed to be gold and silver mines, the acquisition of which would not incur the disfavor of the Eureau of Mines.

Cattle operations north of township 19 are not extensive and it is believed they can be closed out without difficulty. South of township 20 cattle have been concentrated, having been pushed out of the area embodied in the gunnary range.

C. B. Stark proposed to construct a drift fence as shown upon the map and a lease with him includes compensation for the construction of this fence. If the proposed extension is authorized, the C. B. Stark cattle operations will be climinated. This will involve considerable compensation, but this will meet with the approval of the grazing service.

## 7. FALLON TARGET AREA 1 (NAAS VALLON)

This area is presently being used and jurisdiction for the Mavy is being negotiated in the Bureau from the Department of Interior.

Character of land: This is a dry lake bed. Its present use is for dive bombing, principally in connection with a mobile dive bombing target. (See confidential memo concerning other use).

## 8. FALLON TARGET AREA 2 (NAME FALLON)

The land is owned by the Truckee Carson Irrigation District. The area is declineated upon the map 2 in a broken red line.

Fallon Target Area No. 2 (NAAS Fallon) (Cont'd)

Proposed use: Rocket target site.

Possible use: Installation of dummy objectives such as camouflaged planes,

camouflaged gun installations, etc.

Lease forwarded to Bureau and not yet returned.

It is understood that construction of necessary targets has been commenced with approval of Truckee Carson Irrigation District. This oral approval was obtained from the Secretary of the District and transmitted to the Assistant Real Estate Officer together with the information that use of the area by the Navy has been approved by the District by resolution and that the Secretary is authorized to execute an appropriate lease when received.

In view of the fact that rocket targets in the Fallon Aerial Gunnery Range Area are now flooded, construction of the target on area 2 prior to authorization from the Bureau is considered justified. It is understood that no rockets will be fired in this area until officially authorized.

9. FALLON TARGET AREA 3 (8 sq. miles) (NAAS FALLON)

Under jurisdiction of the Department of Interior, Grazing Service.

Transfer to the Department of the Navy is being negotiated by the Bureau.

Construction has commenced upon this area under the same circumstances as above cited for target area 2.

10. FALLON TARGET AREA 4 (1 sq. mile) (NAAS FALLON)

Lease upon this area is pending in the Bureau. This area is within the Walker River Indian Reservation and preliminary negotiations conducted with the Superintendent indicates the granting of lease with nominal rental is to be expected. Actual negotiations with the Tribal Council has not been undertaken because the lease has not been forwarded from the Bureau. Construction has been commenced upon this area under the same circumstances as above cited with the approval of the Superintendent. This approval is to be confirmed by the Tribal Council as soon as possible and will be undertaken immediately.

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# 11. GUSTINE (510 acros) (NAAS, CROWS LANDING)

Lease held interest acquired by condemnation. Notice of filing of order for immediate possession transmitted to N.A.B. 18 November 1944.

12. HOLLISTER (NAAS HOLLISTER) (440 acres of land acquired)

Acquired Lease hold interest by condemnation, order of possession dated 13 July 1943. Lease NOy(R) 35804 executed and condemnation action will be dismissed.

13. JENNER (NAAS SANTA ROSA)

Condemnation action requested by letter of 13 October 1944. To date not authorized.

14. STEWART'S POINT

Investigation reveals that the land comprising this target site is too expensive for acquisition.

15. KLAMATH FALLS, ORE.

This area is being handled by Com, 13 and is being used by Naval Air Facilities operating out of 13th Naval District.

16. LAKE CHABOT. (NAS ALAMEDA)

Machine gun range presently occupied under lease. Recommendation by N.A.B. for acquisition in fee opposed by East Bay Municipal Utilities District as a danger to its water shed. Renegotiations for 10 to 15 year lease recommended by Com. 12.

# 17. LOYELOCK AERIAL CUNNERY RANCE (NAAS FALLON) (1,500,000 acres)

This property is being acquired by expropriation - shown on map No. 3. It is expected this area will be available for commencement of gunnery operations on 1 December 1944. Writer does not know how long it will take to construct markers for gunnery runs. This area has all been approved by the Secretary of the Navy.

Although the Secretary of the Navy has authorized the acquisition of this area by expropriation and Com. 12 has been advised to proceed, actual approval and transfer of jurisdiction from the Secretary of the Interior has not been received in so far as information presently available indicates.

Delinested upon said map in blue pencil are gunnery runs proposed by N.A.B. The rectangular places indicate location of markers.

Specifications have been prepared and it is understood that bids will soon be let for construction of these markers. Before construction of permanent markers, the area is to be surveyed and temporary lime markers are to be laid down. Upon approval of location of these lime markers, permanent markers are to be constructed. Location of these markers is understood to be predicated upon two basic requirements:

- (a) A six mile safety area from the exterior boundaries. The basis of this requirement is an estimated maximum carrying capacity of 50 caliber shells fired.
- (b) A twelve mile air room space between courses to prevent danger of collisions.

It is understood that it is proposed to make runs in either a clockwise or counter clockwise direction within the North and South range respectively. The North range operating as a unit and the South range operating as a unit. No firing runs are to cross the Western Pacific Railroad, but planes so operated South thereof are to confine their activities to the area South of the railroad and the same applies to those operated North. It should be noted that the six mile safety distance to exterior boundaries of the range is not adhered to in the beginning or end of the gunnery runs with the exception of the North end of the West run on the North range. It appears that the six mile safety premise is considered to be too conservative. The 12 mile safety requirement between runs is not violated in any case.

Accepting these safety requirements, N.A.B. has proposed a maximum use of the range. However, it appears obvious that a large portion of the Black Rock Desert in the Northwest corner of the North range is not used by the proposed target runs. At first glance it would appear unreasonable to construct a target run which will compel abandoming rich ranches when a bending of this run to the West of the desert area would permit exclusion of this property. The ranch alluded to is the Delong Ranch which is shown upon Map 3 in green and blue stripes. North thereof is the Capelli property, also a valuable cattle ranch. This ranch can be avoided and all safety distances maintained by alter the course of the markers in accordance with the green broken line labeled S-1. If this alteration of course is acceptable it is proposed to grant

Delong and Capolli revocable permits to continue cattle operations or dispose of this matter as otherwise directed by the Bureau.

Unless full use is made of the gunnery area the Navy Department may incur considerable criticism for depriving the owners of these ranches of their property. More complete use might be made of the areas now constituted and the taking of the Delong and Capelli ranches justified by the use of a course marked in a green broken line and labeled S-2. This suggested course violates distance requirements between courses reducing them at the nearest point to 8 miles and would permit firing only in an easterly direction for the northerly 18 miles of the course.

The Commanding Officer, NAAS Fallon, telephoned the Assistant Real Estate Officer this morning stating that Senator McCarran had interposed with the Commanding Officer on behalf of DeLong and Capelli. It is therefore believed that the matter of utilization of the whole area of the North Range or justification of the present proposed use is of some urgency.

# 18. LOVELOCK TARGET AREAS 1, 2, 3, and 4

These areas are being procedsed as requested by N.A.B. The matter has been transmitted to EuDocks.

A proposal to permit the Commandant to negotiate for use of areas requested was refused by the C.N.O. The areas requested are delineated upon Map 3 in red.

## 19. MADERA

Request for transfer of jurisdiction from Mrmy to Navy is being processed. First endorsement on N.A.B.'s request By Com. 12 is dated 10 November 1944.

## 20. PETALUMA (640 mcres)

Leasehold acquired by condemnation. Order of possession dated 6 November 1944.

## 21. PYRAMID LAKE, NEVADA

Condemnation action filed. Lease has been negotiated and fully executed for Pyramid Lake Ranch as a site for shore facilities.

A lease has been negotiated with Paiute Indian tribe for use of lake for torpedo dropping.

The lake is presently being used for dive bombing and N.A.B. requested permission to use it for strafing. The dive bombing targets presently established in the lake are shown upon Map 3. A water borne mobile bombing target operates north of Latitude 40° North. A representative of the Commandant negetiated with the Indian Tribal Council for permission to dive bomb and strafe and the resolution permitting strafing and dive bombing was entered in the minutes. This formal permission to dive bomb and strafe is proposed to be obtained by modification to the lease which grants use of the lake for torpede dropping.

# Pyramid Lake, Nevada (Cont'd)

This modification will have to be processed through the Indian Service, Department of the Interior.

There is no objection to proposed dive bombing operations, however attention is called to the existence of a railroad on the west side of said lake and the fact that this railroad transports ammunition with every train which passes the lake. Information concerning the extent and time of train traffic and the possibility of coordinating railroad and Navy activities to provide safety for both is being obtained from the traffic control superintendent at Ogden, Utah.

The activities conducted and proposed in Pyramid Lake are known upon Map 3. The direction of strafing runs are marked in the area in which strafing is proposed to be conducted.

## 22. TRINIDAD

leashful 640 acres of land has been acquired by condemnation. Order for possession issued 4 October 1944.

#### 23. VERNALIS

160 acres has been obtained by condemnation. Order for immediate possession issued 14 July 1943.

# 24. WINNEMUCCA TARGET AREAS 1, 2, 3, 4

No request has been made for target areas in the vicinity of Winnemucea. However, certain land is available for this purpose if the request is processed. The areas which are available are marked upon Map 3 in green. Where a checkerboard green pattern appears any one square mile marked in green is available. There a larger solid green area is marked any 10 square miles area is available.



- 5. It is now apparent that pursuance of this acquisition by the Department of the Navy would meet with solid opposition from these influential groups. It is considered that the resultant adverse public relations would be most detrinental to the Navy and should be avoided.
- 6. In view of the foregoing, the request for the target is withdrawn and all Haval District interest in Frank's Tract is terminated.
