## Activities:

On September 22, 1916, the Fourteenth Company, Coast Artillery Corps, National Guard of California was organized and austered into the service of the State at Los Angeles. Daniel K. Smyth was ploted Captain and Harry L. Atwood First Lieutenant of the new company. About seven months after its organization, the Fourteenth Company was called into Federal Service for duty guarding railroad property, factories and munitions plants against sabotage. The Seven months during which the unit was in the service of the State were months of unusual activity. During that time the unit drilled regularly and faithfully. The Fourteenth Company was mustered into the Federal Service on April 25, 1917, and in August, 1917, was redesignated Eighth Company, Second Coast Defense Command, San Diego. On January 1, 1918, the Fourteenth Company was one of the four companies to furnish an number of recruits for the organization of Sattery B, Sixty-Fifth Coast Artillery Corps, These former members of Fourteenth Company saw active service in France and participated in many decisive battles. \*\*\*
