Activities:

The twentieth Company, Coast Artillery Corps, National Guard of California, was organized and mustered into the Mational Guard, September 29, 1916. The organization selected Roy E. Prentiss for Captain and Charles E. Berry as First Lieutenant. The Company had not been in existance quite a year when it was called into Federal service. No special activities are recorded in the papers of the Company, but a full schedule of drill and training is indicated in the Company's monthly returns.

Several coast artillery companies were called into Federal service by President Wilson in April, 1917., but the Twentieth Company was not mustered in until August 25, 1917, on which date the unit entered the United States service and was redesignated Eighth Company, Second Coast Defense Command, Los Angeles.
