2309 TOTHER REES The Twenty-Third Company, Coast Artillery Corps was mustered anto the National Guard on October 6, 1917, at Long Beach, California. Seventy-Two names were on the first muster roll. James W. McCown was elected Captain and Daniel A. Deal, First Lieutenant.

CALIFORNIA M-TRINGL GUARD

The unit immediately assumed the task of developing into an efficient company of the Mational Guard.

The Twenty-Third Company was in the National Guard only about ten months, when on August 28, 1917, the organization was mustered into Federal Service and redesignated the Eleventh Company, Second Coast Defense Command, Los Angeles.
