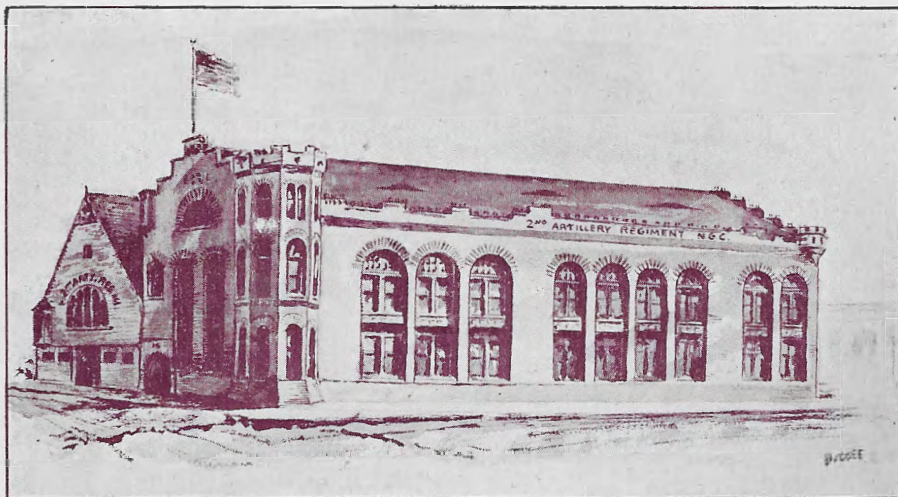

This Company, the outcome of the turbulent period in 1877, known as the "Kearney Riots," was the South Park Company of the Committee of Safety, commanded by Harry S. Craven, C. E., U. S. Navy, assisted by R. C. Hooker, ex-Lieutenant U. S. Navy.

After many vicissitudes it was admitted to the State service with the above title, through the indomitable exertions of Colonel W. R. Smedberg, who secured recruits and a large appropriation of funds to procure uniforms and equipments.

Mustered in April 3, 1878, with 90 members under Captain Francis W. Bacon, it commenced its unparalleled career of proud success, becoming justly famous and the pride of our citizens.

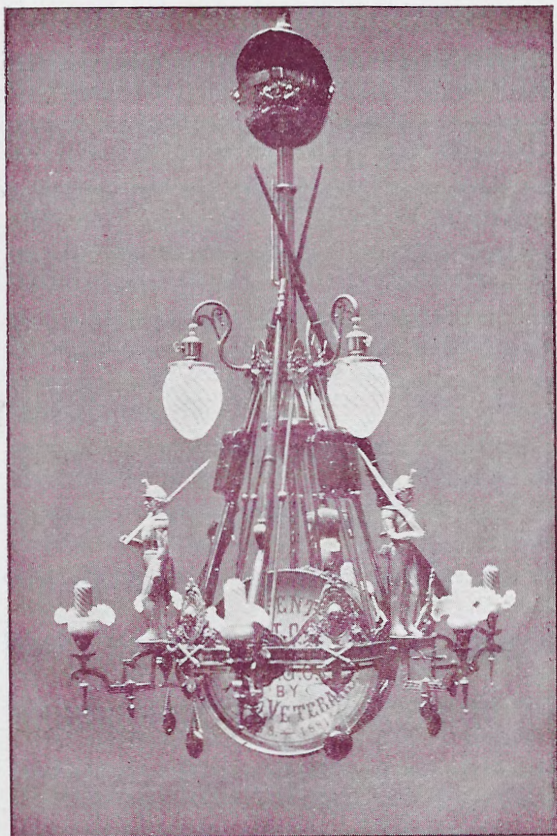
