**Activities:**

Field Hospital Company No. 2 was organized at San Jose, and mustered in as a unit of the California National Guard, July 25, 1917. Examinations for the recruits were held during that day, in the library room of the Twohy Building, by Dr. D. E. Barney, of Troop C Cavalry. There were sixty-five members enrolled in the company, and recruiting was to continue until an enrollment of eighty was reached. Enlistments in this branch of the service were easily secured, and on August 5, 1917, Field Hospital Company No. 2 was mustered into Federal Service as 158th Field Hospital Company, 115th Sanitary Train, 40th Division.\*\*\*
