### Activities:

Company G, Infantry, was mustered in as a unit of the California National Guard on June 1, 1920. Merriwell J. Pyne was appointed Captain and Fred W. Howard the First Lieutenant of the new organization. On February 1, 1921, the unit was assigned to the Third Separate Battalion as Company G.

Company G took part in the parade and exercises of May 30, 1921.

The unit attended two encampments before being assigned to the 160th Infantry Regiment. The first was held at Santa Cruz, September 12 to September 26, 1920. The camp and all instructions were under the supervision of Lieutenant-Colonel Harold Coburn, United States Army.

From July 10 to July 26, 1921, the National Guard encamped at Yosemite National Park. From the monthly company return of July 1921, the following information was taken:

July 9

July 12 Company left home station and entrained for National Guard encampment at Yosemite, California, via Pacific Electric to Los Angeles, (21 miles), Southern Pacific Railroad to Merced(289 miles), Yosemite Valley Railroad to El Portal, California, (79 miles), marched 8 miles to encampment site and made camp.

July 12

July 24 Participated in all drills, training and instruction.

July 24 Broke camp, marched 14 miles to
El Portal, California. Entrained
for home station. Arrived there
July twenty-fifth at 3:00 P. M.

About a month later, Company G became one of the units in the first full regiment to be organized in the California National Guard after the World War. The Second, Third and Fourth Battalions were organized into the 160th Infantry Regiment. The Third Battalion, of which Company G formed a part, was redesignated the Second Battalion. Thus Company G became Company G, Second Battalion, 160th Infantry Regiment on August 23, 1921.
