B	June 29, 1916	Arrived at Mobilization Camp, Sacramento, California, June 26, 1916.	Howard S. Tracy, Captain	Nov. 11, 1916
C	June 29, 1916	Mustered into United States Service June twenty-ninth. Entrained at Sacramento July third. Arrived at Nogales, Arizona, July 6, 1916. Established camp one and three-fourth miles north from Nogales, July seventh. Performed routine camp duties at that station until September ninth. September tenth broke Camp at Nogales. Marched via Nogales Pumping Plant, Patagonia, Old Fort Crittenden, Elgin and Clark's Ranch near Fort Huachuca to Garden Canyon, a distance of sixty-eight miles from Nogales. Arrived	Everett W. Peckham, Captain. Resigned Sept. 28, 1916. Edward H. Marxen, First Lieutenant, in command of Co. C, Sept. 28 to Oct. 13. Edward H. Marxen, commissioned Captain Oct. 13, 1916, and commanded Co. C, until Regiment was mustered out of Federal Service Nov. 11, 1916.	Nov. 11, 1916

G	June 29, 1916	September fifteenth. Remained at Garden Canyon until September twenty-fourth performing various battalion and regimental problems, practiced marches, etc. Broke camp at Garden Canyon	Adolph G. Johnson, Captain	Nov. 11, 1916
H	June 29, 1916	September twenty-fifth and marched four miles to Fort Huachuca Rifle Range. Daily target practice at the rifle range until October seventh, on which date orders were received for this Regiment to return at once to State Mobilization camp for muster out of United State Service. Broke camp at Fort Huachuca Rifle Range	Archibald D. Borden, Captain	Nov. 11, 1916
I	June 29, 1916	October seventh and marched via Pyatt Ranch, Parker's Ranch, and Patagonia to permanent camp at Nogales, Arizona. Arriving there October tenth. Remained in camp at Nogales until October eighteenth when the regiment broke camp and left for Los Angeles, California. Arrived at Los Angeles October twentieth. Established camp at Exposition Park, Los Angeles, California, October twenty-first. Paraded through streets of Los Angeles October thirtieth. Remained in camp at Exposition Park, Los Angeles, performing routine camp duties until the Regiment was mustered out of the Federal Service, November 11, 1916.	Bert M. Muzzey, Captain	Nov. 11, 1916
