On August twenty-ninth and thirtieth the Company participated in maneuvers with the Second California Infantry and the Utah Cava in territory adjacent to Mogales during which time ten miles of wire were lait and all messages handled in a satisfactory manner. In September and October the usual camp routine was followed except on Septemb fourteenth and fifteenth the company participated in maneuvers with the Idaho I fantry and the First Batta	lry d

vo Tof California Field Artillery on Patagonia Road near the Santa Cruz River during which time approximately fifteen miles of wire were laid and messages handled. And on September seventeenth and eighteenth the company participated in maneuvers with the Connecticut Infantry in the same district, laid eight miles of wire, established eight stations and eleven messages were transmitted. Company B entrained at Nogales October nineteenth and arrived at Los Angeles, California, October twenty-first, and established camp at Exposition Park, Los Angeles, where they were stationed until mustered out of the service.
