Activities:

On December 13, 1864, forty-five men all residents of the City and County of San Francisco, signed a petition and presented it to County Judge Samuel Cowles, requesting that he appoint some suitable person to superintend the meeting to organize a volunteer militia company. Judge Cowles named Colonel Fred Tittle as the supervisor, and selected the Headquarters of the California Fusileers on the corner of Bush and Montgomery Streets, San Francisco, as the place to hold the meeting. On December twenty-sixth the Sheridan Guard, Company C, was organized and mustered in as an unattached company of the Second Brigade, under the command of Captain Gerard Brigaert.

There is only a meager source of information concerning this company's activities, but it is assumed that interest in military affairs waned with the close of the Civil War in 1865. The records show that the Sheridan Guard in 1866 was virtually disbanded and the company so demoralized that a muster roll could not be obtained.*

In 1866 when the military system of the State was reorganized, the force was reduced to eighty companies in all and those left in service were to compose the new National Guard. The State Legislature created a Board of Location and Organization
