MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Coat of Arms and Distinctive Insignia for the 132nd Engineer Battalion, California National Guard

- 1. The coat of arms and distinctive insignia approved for the 132nd Engineer Battalion by letter QMIH-A 424.2 & 421.4 - 132d Engr Bn, Calif NG. this Institute, subject as above, dated 28 February 1961, are rescinded this date.
- 2. The above action is taken in accordance with letter NG-AROTO 1002-Ol - California, National Guard Bureau, Subject: Reorganization of the Army National Guard, dated 20 December 1967, extract of which is attached. The 132nd Engineer Battalion was deleted from the California Troop Allotment on 29 January 1968; concurrently Headquarters and Headquarters Company was consolidated with Companies A and E to form the 140th Engineer Company.

3. The 140th Engineer Company is not entitled to inherit the coat of arms and distinctive insignia of the 132nd Engineer Battalion.

l. The cost of arms redesignated this date for the 132d Engineer Pattalion, California National Guard was approved for the 132d Armored Engineer Nattalion, California National Guard by letter CMCRH 424.2 & 421.4 - 132d Armot Engr Po, Cal NG, Office of The Cuartermaster General, 20 December 1954.

2. The blazonry and description are as follows:

## PLAZOHRY

SHIELD: Per saltire gules and argent, on and over a bar agure (light) between a Lorraine cross of the second and a fleur-de-lis buff fimbriated of the fourth, an Indian arreshesd of the last.

CREST: That for the regiments and separate battalions of the California National Guard: On a wreath of the colors (argent and gales) the setting oun behind a grissly bear passent on a grassy field all proper.

MOTTO: Aedificate ad Pugnandum (Build to Fight).

#### March 1997

Red and white are the colors for the Corps of Engineers. The Lorrains cross represents battle honors awarded the erganization for service as Engineers during World War I and the flour-de-lis in buff for service as Quartermaster during World War II. The bar in the color of the Eurean service ribbon symbolises service in that area. The arrowhead alludes to an assault landing in Africa.

The distinctive insignia redesignated this date for the 132d Engineer Battalian, California National Guard was approved for the 132d Armored Engineer Battalian, California National Guard by letter CMG-H 424.2 & 421.4 132nd Armod Engr Bn, Cal NG, Office of The Guartermaster General, 20 December 1954.
- 5. The distinctive insignia (metal type for wear on the shoulder loops) consists of the shield and motto of the cost of arms for this organisation which is described in paragraph 1.

TO BE WORK: As prescribed by current regulations.

- 6. Records indicate the samples of distinctive insignia were approved for the 132d Armored Engineer Sattalion, California Matienal Guard by letter CHGEN 421.4 132nd Armd Engr Bn, Calif NO, Office of The Quarternaster General, 8 August 1955. The mammfacturer of the insignia was N. S. Neyer, Inc., 215 East 91st Street, New York 28, New York. However, if the services of another mammfacturer are desired, a painting of the distinctive insignia will be forwarded upon request.
- 7. This redesignation is in accordance with letter, NG-AROTO 325.4 California, Office of the National Guard Bureau, subject: Reorganisation of the Army National Guard 1958-60, dated 23 April 1959.

## DESCRIPTION

Red and white are the colors for the Corps of Engineers. The Legralms cross represents battle beners swarded the organization for service as Engineers during World War I and the fleur-ds-lis in buff for service as Quartermaster during World War II. The bar in the color of the Korean service ribben symbolises service in that area. The arrowhead alludes to an assault landing in Africa.

2. The distinctive insignia for the 132nd Armored Engineer Battelion, California Matienal Guard, is approved. The distinctive insignia consists of the shield and motto of the seat of arms for the organization, which is described in paragraph 1.
