## COAST ARTILLERY CORPS

#### Activities:

On June 15, 1920, Brigadier General James J. Borree, the Adjutant General of the State of California, authorized Major David P. Hardy, Coast Artillery Reserve Corps, United States Army, to organize a Coast Artillery Company in San Francisco<sup>#</sup> As a result of Special Order No. 31, dated June 15, 1920, First Company, Coast Artillery Corps was recruited and mustered in as a Unit of the California National Guard on June 16, 1920. David P. Hardy, Captain, and Walter R. Miller, First Lieutenant, were assigned to command the Artillery Unit.

The First Company, Coast Artillery Corps was redesignated First Company, First Provisional Battelion Coast Artillery Corps, California National Guard, on February 7, 1921.

The only activities of the Company during the period, June 16, 1920 to March 25, 1921, were the drills and monthly meetings. On March 25, 1921, First Company, first Provisional Battalion together with the Second, Third and Fourth Companies of that Battalion became the First Coast Defense Command, Coast Artillery Corps, California National Guard.

For activities of this Unit subsequent to March 25, 1921, refer to the History of the Coast Defense Command, Coast Artillery Corps, California National Guard, Adjutant General's Office.
