Activitiess

Minth Company, Coast Artillery Corps, was first organised in San Francisco, California, on April 28, 1921. Although the Company was mustered in as a Unit of the State forces, it was not accepted by the Federal Government, for the reason that the quota allotted by the Militia Bureau for 1920-1921 permitted only eight companies of Coast Artillery for the State of California. After an existance of approximately six weeks, the Minth Company, Coast Artillery Corps was discontinued.

On November 28, 1921, another Company was organised at Long Beach, California, and designated as Einth Company, Coast Artillery Corps; sustered into the State service and accepted by the Militia Bureau at Washington. This Company was made possible by the new quota of two additional Companies of Coast Artillery authorised by the Militia Bureau for the years 1921-1922. Kenneth M. Bar-

ager, Captain, was assigned to command the new Company. On December 12, 1921, First Lieutemant, Edgar H. Kienholts was also assigned to the Minth Company. On December 14, 1921, the Company was mustered and inspected for Federal resegnition by Rebert C. Cotton, Major of Infantry, United States Army.

On January 9, 1922, Minth Company, Coast Artillery Corps, was redesignated 467th Company, Coast Artillery Corps, and on March 15, 1922, the 467th Company, Coast Artillery Corps, was redesignated 467th Company, First Coast Defense Command, Coast Artillery Corps, California National Guard. The only activities of the Company were the weekly drills and meetings.
