

## **U. S. NAVAL RECEIVING HOSPITAL**

Geneva Ave. and Moscow Street  
San Francisco, 12, California

On 9 December 1945, this hospital completed one full year of service to the personnel of the Navy and as we approach the date to be decommissioned and disestablished, it would seem fitting and proper that a permanent record, in the form of a booklet, be compiled and issued to all hands, as a treasured memento of this hospital's contribution to the war effort.

The U. S. Naval Receiving Hospital at San Francisco is an unusual type of hospital. Because of the urgent need of an intermediate hospital activity, a Receiving Hospital was decided upon, and established for the sole purpose of providing hospital quarters and necessary treatment for battle casualties evacuated from hostile theatres, during the short interval following their disembarkation from ships.

Here they were screened and regrouped, then entrained and transferred to other naval hospitals throughout the country, as near to their homes as possible, so that their convalescence could be enhanced and the opportunity afforded, for frequent visits of his relatives.

The uncommon success of this innovation and the smooth operation of our function is directly attributable to the whole hearted cooperation and painstaking efforts on the part of the officers and enlisted personnel of the staff. To these worthy shipmates I extend my sincere thanks and appreciation for a job well done.




*History  
of  
Receiving Hospital*

*M*obile Hospital 13 was originally assembled in the fall of 1943 at the Medical Supply Depot at Brooklyn, New York. Three Hospital Corps Officers and the Executive Officer were ordered to the supply depot to report to the Medical Officer in Command for assembly and commissioning of the hospital and for duty out when commissioned.

This hospital was being assembled in echelons, both as to personnel and materials. The personnel comprised a total of 594 enlisted men and 56 officers. No nurse complement was assigned. The material was being assembled at the Naval Supply Depot, Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania. A detail was ordered to the supply depot to weigh, cube, mark and pack all materials.

In December 1944, Captain Gasser was relieved and Captain G. W. Smith reported. The name was then changed to Fleet Hospital 113.



Upon reporting it was learned that negotiations were under way for the leasing of San Francisco property for the erection of the hospital in the Bay Area. In September materials began to arrive from the East and the contractor began his construction.

On December 9, 1944, Admiral Carleton H. Wright, Commandant of the Twelfth Naval District, commissioned Fleet Hospital 113 and turned the command over to Captain Smith. The hospital consisted of sixty-one task-force type buildings. They comprised the Admin-

istration building, medical and surgical wards, galley, mess halls and a recreation building which offered a movie hall, telephone center, Red Cross service and ship's store. There were also maintenance buildings, garage, storerooms, laundry, bagroom, partitioned stadiums and a recreation field.

The mission of Fleet Hospital 113 was to be that of a receiving hospital for overseas casualties and a naval hospital for nearby activities. Secondly it was to act as a training center for newly indoctrinated medical officers and hospital corpsmen.

# FIRST

By December 1944, preparations had matured sufficiently to make possible the reception of the hospital's first patients. Essentials were ready but the ravages of conversion of park to hospital were still in evidence. The drab buildings in their setting of churned mud offered little of cheer to the expected patients. But every ward and department worker turned to with redoubled effort.

The solitary Red Cross representative, Patricia Cummings, summoned her volunteers. The San Francisco



# CHRISTMAS

Examiner sent cash gifts, clubs and organizations brought miscellaneous presents, the telephone center prepared a party setting as the wires were readied for home calls. And when the first patients arrived on December 24th it was to a hospital steeped in the spirit of Christmas. All that week incoming patients received the same happy welcome. It was a triumph of understanding and cooperation.




As the hospital grew, the staff increased apace. Doctors, besides dispensing medicine and surgery to regular patients, headed departments and passed on the classification and disposition of R. P. O. patients. (Most patients were admitted for ration purposes only.)

Nurses were in charge of wards and the patients therein. They supervised the work of the corpsmen in caring for the constantly changing patient personnel. Together they carried out the doctors' directions, they kept records on each patient and notified him of his out-going draft. And feverishly on Friday, they prepared for Inspection.



The receiving of casualties continued at the rate of over a thousand a week. The process of taking men from the hold of a ship, transporting them to this hospital, and eventually disbursing them to other hospitals throughout the country was directed through the Draft Coordinator's Office.



Men of the "General Detail" became proficient in handling stretchers, large groups of men, and upper berths, for most patients were taken by train to their next hospital. Many of the draft escorts have thousands of miles of "train time" to their credit.



From the ship the newly arrived veteran was whisked directly to the hospital. It was important that his reception center be as pleasant as possible.

To that end the Outside Detail spent the early months of '45 grading, sodding and planting.



The original shrubbery of the park was carefully sustained and new flowers and foliage were added. The scarred turf and rutted roads gave way to green lawns and paved streets.



Interiors changed too. The first decks proved inadequate for the heavy traffic and new decks were installed. Nurses and ward corps-men held up well.



If not filled, hundreds of beds were held in readiness at all times. Bed tags changed weekly as occupants departed and were replaced by members of the newest "convoy."



To the returning casualty Fleet Hospital 113 was a pause for adjustment. On home soil again he could offer thanks at the daily mass in the Catholic Chaplain's office or at Protestant worship in the afternoon. On Sunday morning the theater was converted into a chapel for both the Catholic and Protestant services.
