Oakland, California, left Oakland for home station May twelfth. TF Arrived at Los Angeles and relieved from further active duty May thirteenth.

The members of the Company began to assemble early on the eighteenth.* By 2:00 P.M. 70% of the members had reported. Stationed at: Jefferson Square. San Francisco. until the afternoon of April twentieth. then noved to: Goldon Gata Park. San Francisco, ** remaining there until April twenty-second when the company again moved to: Jefferson Square, Sant Francisco, 2 details were furnished for every kind of duty including camp duty, street patrol, wagon guards, orderlies, and distributing supplies. Assisted in establishing telephone and telegraph lines between military stations. Haight and Cole Streets. San Francisco, 22 May second to May thirty-first, chiefly in construction and mainteanance of telephone and telegraph lines between various districts. Headquarters in the city. Very good work done. Three miles of telephone lines laid in cable slot of the street railway. Taking in of entire system accomplished in less than twenty-four hours. This included about twenty miles of wire. Except eight men left in charge of State property, the company was discharged May 31, 1906.X
